COUNTY COMMISSIONS OF VETERANS AFFAIRS ALLOCATION PROGRAM

- 1. The attached information is provided as required in Iowa Code Chapter 35A.14 to report on the implementation of the county commissions of veterans affairs training program and fund.
- 2. Iowa Code Chapter 35B.6 defines the training and certification requirements for county executive directors or administrators, the duties of the employees of the county office of veterans affairs, and the office location and minimum hours requirements.
- 3. The General Assembly appropriated \$990,000 to this program in FY-11. Each county received an allocation of \$10,000 to assist with the requirements of lowa Code Chapter 35B.6.
