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FY2025 ANNUAL REPORT

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YEAR IN REVIEW

The Interstate Commission for Adult Offender Supervision (ICAOS) focused on innovation and practical resources to enhance public safety, accountability, and fair outcomes in FY2025. Key initiatives included a major capital investment to replace the outdated Interstate Compact Offender Tracking System (ICOTS), advancements in data-driven decision-making, and a renewed focus on due process and consistent practices across all member states.

YEAR BY THE NUMBERS

- 14,507 Active Warrants (8,210 NCIC Verified)
- 10,593 Sex Offenders under supervision (9.2% of total)
- 24,344 Active Parole cases
- 91,541 Active Probation cases

KEY HIGHLIGHTS & ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- **Technology Modernization:** The Commission approved a \$1.2 million capital investment to replace ICOTS with a new platform called INSITE (Interstate National System for Information, Tracking, and Enforcement). This new system is expected to launch in Summer 2026 and will lead to significant long-term savings in hosting and maintenance costs.
- **Due Process & Reform:** The RNR (Risk-Needs-Responsivity) Workgroup, in partnership with the Center for Effective Public Policy, developed a decision-making tool to bring more consistency and fairness to retaking decisions, particularly for individuals with stable housing, jobs, and community support. The Commission also adopted person-centered language in its rules.
- **Training and Education:** New resources were launched to equip practitioners, including an updated Hearing Officers' Guide, a Compliance Guide for Commissioners, expanded outreach through podcasts and presentations, and leadership development for Deputy Compact Administrators.
- **Financial Performance:** An independent audit resulted in an "unmodified ('clean') opinion" for FY2025, with no material weaknesses identified. The Commission earned over \$48,000 in interest and dividends and closed the fiscal year with a reserve and investment fund balance of \$1.9 million.

COMPLIANCE REPORTS

The compliance reports provide at a glance compliance with specific activity timeframes for compact processes. Iowa's compliance stats are above the national average on all parameters.
