Fiscal Year 2026 Iowa Reading Research Center Dyslexia Expenditures

The 2024 Iowa Acts, chapter 1152 (Senate File 2435) requires the Iowa Reading Research Center (IRRC) to use not more than \$250,000 on its total appropriation for:

...collaborations with the State Board of Education relating to the approval of practitioner preparation programs pursuant to section 256.7, subsection 3, paragraph "c", and with the Board of Educational Examiners for the establishment and continuing oversight of the advanced dyslexia specialist endorsement pursuant to section 256.146, subsection 21.

Below is a summary of IRRC's Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 expenses related to the Advanced Dyslexia Special Endorsement. Expenditures reported through April 2025 and based on claims paid by the Iowa Department of Education. Claims for the remainder of FY25 will be submitted and paid by the close of the current fiscal year.
