**ANNUAL REPORT – FISCAL YEAR 2006**  
(Academic Year 2005-06)

Pursuant to Iowa Code Section 261.111, the Iowa College Student Aid Commission provides the following report on the Iowa Teacher Shortage Forgivable Loan Program.

The Iowa Teacher Shortage Forgivable Loan Program is supported by appropriations from the State of Iowa, and also by special federal appropriations. As a result of the efforts of Iowa Senator Tom Harkin, nearly \$4 million in federal funding has been appropriated to allow Iowa's program to assist future teachers. Federal funding will be completely expended during Fiscal Year 2008, and the Commission has been told that additional federal funding will not be available. Appendix A provides information concerning historical state appropriations and federal grant assistance.

In 1999, as Iowa college students were accumulating greater debt from student loans, and out-of-state school districts were bringing attractive recruitment packages to Iowa campuses, the Iowa Teacher Shortage Forgivable Loan Program was created to encourage students to remain in Iowa and receive forgiveness on state-funded loans.

The goal of the Iowa Teacher Shortage Forgivable Loan Program is to invest in Iowans who will use their talents and educations as teachers in high-need positions in Iowa's elementary and secondary schools. Eligible Iowa residents attending Iowa colleges or universities may receive the Forgivable Loans of up to \$3,000 per academic year for up to a total of \$9,000. Loans are provided to sophomore, junior, senior, and graduate level students. Recipients are required to be enrolled at least half-time in accredited education programs leading to degrees and certification for teaching in designated shortage areas. Appendix B provides information about the number of students assisted at each Iowa college and university during Fiscal Year 2006 and prior years and the dollar amounts awarded at each institution. Appendix C provides the shortage areas as determined by the Iowa Department of Education.

Loans are forgiven at the rate of 20 percent per year for each of five years that the graduate teaches in the chosen area of specialty in any Iowa school -- public or private.
