Dear Mr. Marshall and Ms. Thomson:

In accordance with <u>lowa Code</u> 262A (University Buildings, Facilities and Services – Revenue Bonds) Section 3, which requires the annual submittal of the Board of Regents Five-Year Capital Building Program to the General Assembly, please find enclosed the Board's program for FY 2006 through FY 2010. The program contains a list of the buildings and facilities which the Board deems necessary to further the educational objectives of the institutions. In the Board's judgment, these capital projects represent the identified needs at the Regent institutions.

Section 262A.3 also requires an estimate of the maximum amount of Academic Building Revenue Bonds which the Board would issue to finance the Board's requests in the ensuing biennium. These estimates are \$17 million for FY 2006 and \$17 million for FY 2007.

Board of Regents, State of Iowa Five-Year Capital Building Program FY 2006 - FY 2010

The Board is required by statute to submit a five-year, state-funded building program to the General Assembly at the beginning of each legislative session.

The Board's five-year capital plan reflects institutional strategic planning, focuses on stewardship of existing resources through correction of deferred maintenance and fire safety deficiencies, and renovations and infrastructure improvements needed to meet the priorities of the Board's 2004 – 2009 Strategic Plan.

With enactment of the multi-year bonding package for academic building during the 2004 legislative session, only funding to correct deferred maintenance and fire safety deficiencies is requested in the amount of \$15 million each in FY 2006 and FY 2007. Funding to correct these deficiencies is also the highest priority in years FY 2008 – FY 2010 of the Five-Year Program.

The state funds appropriated would drive internal university budget reallocations to further increase building repair budgets. By FY 2010, the annual internal institutional budget for this purpose would equal at least one-half the amount of state appropriation for correction of these deficiencies.

The Five-Year Plan includes, in the out-years (FY 2008 – FY 2010), construction of a very limited number of new facilities, most of which are very specialized; the need for the facilities is based upon programmatic justification. In some instances, existing buildings, which cannot cost-effectively be remodeled to meet the programmatic needs, would be razed after completion of the new construction.

The Board's five-year program (FY 2006 to FY 2010) includes projects totaling \$302.7 million, of which \$218 million are requested from the state.
