Iowa Veterans Identification Project (IVIP)

Summary

IVIP is an enhancement of the functions of the state and (relevant) county commissions of Veterans affairs. Our shared success in helping more wartime veterans and surviving spouses maintain their ability to pay privately for senior living care depends on this collaboration. The program affords families a choice as members enter their post retirement years by accessing federal VA pension and health benefits. In this way, the VA pension is an attractive alternative to families that otherwise might have to rely on Medicaid to pay for nursing home care. Significant positive results for the State budget can be expected as the burden on Medicaid is lessened and more residents are able to pay privately for their care for longer periods of time.

Progress

In the past seven months, IVIP has helped over four hundred nursing home residents determine their eligibility for federal VA pension and health benefits. Volunteers are still in the process of helping some of those residents file pension claims and/or apply for health benefits. So far, IVIP volunteers have completed and filed a total of 71 pension claims and applications for health benefits. The Iowa Department of Veterans Affairs estimates there about 1,095 senior living community residents in the four counties who may potentially be able to receive these types of VA benefits.

Financial Impact

The average monthly federal VA pension benefit is \$864 and the average monthly federal VA benefit for health services is \$390, according to the Iowa Department of Veterans Affairs. Based on the estimate that IVIP volunteers will help nursing home residents file 120 pension claims and 60 applications for health benefits during FY '06, the potential financial gain over a 12-month period to the state if 75 percent of the claims are successful amounts to \$1,143,720. Given the General Fund appropriation of \$50,000, the State would see a return of \$22.87 for each dollar appropriated. Since successful claims are paid out over the lifetime of the claimant, the return on investment increases dramatically over time. For example, the State would see a return of \$114 for each dollar appropriated in FY '06 on IVIP based on an estimated \$5,718,600 in federal VA benefits paid out to Iowa seniors over a five-year period.
