Re: Iowa Code section 8.7 Gifts, Bequests, and Grants Summary Report

Dear Division Director Lyons:

INTRODUCTION:

The 81st General Assembly enacted Iowa Code section 8.7 (2005 Iowa Acts, Ch. 173, Sec. 27) that requires "all gifts, bequests, and grants received by a department or accepted by the governor on behalf of the state" to be reported to the Iowa Ethics and Campaign Disclosure Board (Board) and the Government Oversight Committee.¹

The law further requires the Board by January 31 of each year to "submit to the fiscal services division of the legislative services agency a written report listing all gifts, bequests, and grants received during the previous calendar year with a value of over one thousand dollars and the purpose for each such gift, bequest, or grant."

This report is intended to serve as the Board's report to the Fiscal Services Division of the Legislative Services Agency for the time period of July 1, 2005 through December 31, 2005, as mandated by Iowa Code section 8.7.

IMPLEMENTATION:

The following steps were taken in order to implement the requirements of the new law:

- 1. The Government Oversight Committee stated that it would accept filings with the Board as full compliance with the law and separate filings with the committee were not necessary.
- 2. A report form was created and the Board established a page on its Web site to post filed reports for public inspection.
- 3. In order to embrace current technology, the Board accepted the filing of information on the GEM\$ system in lieu of filing paper reports as compliance with the law (the Board would then take the information from the GEM\$ system and post the information on its Web site). However, this proved to be unworkable as the current GEM\$ system is not updated to reflect the date that a

grant is ultimately received by a department. Thus, it was difficult to determine the time period a grant was received versus other steps in the grant process. Therefore, in the future a department using the GEM\$ system will need to notify the Board that a grant has been received.

- 4. To help departments comply with the law, the Board determined that it would accept copies of internal tracking devices such as excel spreadsheets in lieu of paper reports.
- 5. The Department of Administrative Services has agreed to report on behalf of the other departments allocations from the Vertical Infrastructure Project.
- 6. Several communications were sent to each department concerning the requirements of the new law and the various methods by which reports could be filed.

INTERPRETATION ISSUES:

A number of questions were raised by departments concerning how the statute was to be interpreted. Many questions involved whether the statute contemplated the disclosure of all grants or only competitive grants (the law clearly requires the disclosure of "all" grants).

- 1. IECDB Advisory Opinion 2005-13 concerning sponsor/vendor fees for a conference held by the Department of Elder Affairs and when such fees might trigger the requirement to file a report.
- 2. IECDB Advisory Opinion 2005-14 concerning items donated to the Department of Cultural Affairs State Historical Society when the items were for the citizens of Iowa as opposed to the benefit of the department.
- 3. IECDB Advisory Opinion 2005-15 concerning use of county government space for official state duties by a board attached to the Department of Inspections and Appeals.
- 4. IECDB Advisory Opinion 2005-17 concerning the receipt of gifts by officials or employees as opposed to gifts to a department.
- 5. IECDB Advisory Opinion 2005-22 concerning the IowAccess Advisory Council and the Vertical Infrastructure Advisory Committee that are attached to the Department of Administrative Services and that funding from these sources constituted "grants."

In order to achieve uniform reporting, it will be necessary in the future for the Board to continue providing education to departments on the requirement to file reports as well as interpretations of the law.

It may be necessary to get further clarification from the General Assembly on interpretation issues in the future. As such issues arise, the Board will bring them to the attention of the Government Oversight Committee.

SUMMARY:

- 1. Twenty-eight departments filed at least one gift, bequest, or grant report.
- 2. Twenty-two departments received at least one gift, bequest, or grant in excess of \$1,000.
- 3. The majority of gifts, bequests, and grants received did not exceed \$1,000.
- 4. Ten departments received allocations for major maintenance projects through the Vertical Infrastructure Program.
- 5. The Board determined that funds from the IowAccess Advisory Council constituted "grants." It should be noted that departments do not actually receive these funds. Rather, the funds are sent to the Department of Administrative Services Information Technology Enterprise as fees and that entity provides services to the departments.

- 7. The attached pages are a summary of each gift, bequest, or grant received by a department in excess of \$1,000. In some cases, multiple grants received from the same source were combined into one entry. In addition, allocations from the Vertical Infrastructure Program are included as a separate attachment.

DISCLAIMER:

Information for gifts, bequests, or grants received by a department in excess of \$1,000 was data-entered by Board staff from filed reports. While the Board made every effort to provide accurate information, scrivener error is possible.
