

2015 Report on Expanding Professional Licensing Provisions

Submitted to: Senator Wally E. Horn and Senator Mark Segebart of the Iowa Senate Veteran Affairs Committee and Representative Quentin Stanerson and Representative Jerry A. Kearns of the Iowa House of Representatives Veteran Affairs Committee



OVERVIEW

The Iowa State Board of Health adopted new Chapter 196, “Military Service and Veteran Reciprocity,” 641 Iowa Administrative Code to delineate the process by which licensure applicants who are engaged in active military service or who are veterans of military service may apply for credit toward any experience or education requirement for licensure based on their verified military education, training, or service. The new chapter further specifies the procedures for review of such applications, and provides for the issuance of provisional licenses to veterans licensed in another jurisdiction who have passed the licensure examination and are completing the necessary experience or education requirements. The rules establish the same procedure for all licensing authorities within the department. The Iowa Plumbing and Mechanical Systems Board adopted by reference IAC 641—196. Further, the Department’s Bureau of Professional Licensure established the same procedure for all 19 boards within the Professional Licensure Bureau. Pursuant to the authority of Iowa Code sections 147.76 and 272C.2, each of the 19 Professional Licensing Boards listed below voted to adopt and file a new Chapter 20, “Military Service and Veteran Reciprocity,” 645 Iowa Administrative Code.

RECOMMENDATIONS & PROGRESS OF LICENSING BOARDS ON EXPANDING PROFESSIONAL LICENSING PROVISIONS TO SPOUSES OF MILITARY VETERANS

Twenty-one licensing boards are coordinated through bureaus within the Department of Public Health.

The Bureau of Professional Licensure coordinates the following 19 professional licensing boards.

1. Board of Athletic Training, which licenses athletic trainers
2. Board of Barbering, which licenses barbers, barber shops and barber schools
3. Board of Behavioral Science, which licenses mental health counselors and marriage and family therapists
4. Board of Chiropractic , which licenses chiropractors
5. Board of Cosmetology Arts and Sciences which licenses cosmetologists, estheticians, electrologists, nail technicians, cosmetology salons and cosmetology schools
6. Board of Dietetics, which licenses dietitians
7. Board of Hearing Aid Dispensers, which licenses hearing aid dispensers
8. Board of Massage Therapy, which licenses massage therapists
9. Board of Mortuary Science, which licenses funeral home directors, funeral homes and crematories
10. Board of Nursing Home Administrators, which licenses nursing home administrators
11. Board of Optometry which licenses optometrists
12. Board of Physical and Occupational Therapists, which licenses physical therapists, physical therapist assistants, occupational therapists and occupational therapist assistants

13. Board of Physician Assistants, which licenses physician assistants
14. Board of Podiatry, which licenses podiatrists, orthotists, prosthetists and pedorthists
15. Board of Psychology, which licenses psychologists
16. Board of Respiratory Care, which licenses respiratory therapists
17. Board of Sign Language Interpreters and Transliterators, which licenses sign language interpreters and transliterators
18. Board of Social Work, which licenses social workers at the bachelor, master and independent levels
19. Board of Speech Pathology and Audiology, which licenses speech pathologists and audiologists

Six of the Professional Licensing Boards have met and recommend expanding the professional licensing provisions to include spouses of military veterans as shown in Attachments 1 through 6. The six Boards include the Iowa Board of Barbering, Iowa Board of Mortuary Science, Iowa Board of Nursing Home Administrators, Iowa Board of Optometry, Iowa Board of Physical & Occupational Therapy, and Iowa Board of Speech Pathology and Audiology. Conversely, the Iowa Board of Physician Assistants does not recommend expanding the professional licensing provisions to include spouses of military veterans as it "...would entail too many variables to effectively manage." See Attachment 7. The remaining Professional Licensing Boards administered through the Bureau of Professional Licensure are in the process of obtaining Board recommendations and will submit an addendum to this report prior to February 28, 2015.

20. EMS Certification Program: The Bureau of Emergency and Trauma Services certifies emergency medical care providers under the authority of Iowa Code 147A per the provisions of Iowa Code 272C. The Bureau of Emergency and Trauma Services administers the certification process via IAC 641—131.

The Bureau of Emergency and Trauma Services recommends expanding professional licensing provisions to include spouses of military veterans as detailed in Attachment 8.

21. Iowa Plumbing and Mechanical Systems Board: The Iowa Department of Public Health Division of Acute Disease Prevention, Emergency Response and Environmental Health supports the Iowa Plumbing and Mechanical Systems Board and administers licensing and continuing education requirements for professionals in the plumbing, mechanical, hydronic and refrigeration trades.

The Board recommends expanding professional licensing provisions to include spouses of military veterans as detailed in Attachment 9.

The Iowa Department of Public Health Bureau of Professional Licensure coordinates 19 professional licensing boards. Recommendations from seven Boards were included with the Report on Expanding Professional Licensing Provisions submitted by IDPH in January, 2015. All twelve of the remaining Professional Licensing Boards administered through the Bureau of Professional Licensure have met and recommend expanding the professional licensing provisions to include spouses of military veterans. Additionally, the Iowa Board of Podiatry requests "...legislation drafted pursuant to this recommendation include a definition of spouse that limits the Home Base Iowa spousal privileges to spouses that were married to a veteran during the time the veteran was in active service."
