

## Chief Hageman:

I am writing to submit the final report of Performance Measures outlined in Article VII of Contract # 5882VS01. It has been another successful year for lowa KidSight! A highlight was the publication of a children's book titled "So Much More To See," which educates the public on the importance of early detection and treatment of vision problems, and also helps prepare children for the vision-screening experience. A copy of the children's book is enclosed. Contract measures:

- Submission of a work plan including time lines: See Attachment I.
- The percent of children age four and under who received a vision screening=83.7%

- The percent of children screened who were referred for follow-up = 5.61%
- The percent of children referred who received follow-up as documented by return of the referral by an ophthalmologist or an optometrist = 69.43%\*
- The percent of children who received follow-up who have a vision abnormality = 41.35%\*
- \* Percentages will increase as follow-up effort continues for a full year post screening date.
- The number of new volunteers trained to use the PhotoScreener during the contract period = 227
- The total number of volunteers active in providing the screening during the contract period = 358+
- +Lions Clubs will often take along extra helpers ("Escorts") to carry out vision-screening sessions. Only the Club Contact and Photographers are recorded and logged, so this figure could realistically be doubled. There were 150 different Lions Clubs extending the service during the contract period.
- The location and number of active volunteers shown on a state map: See *Attachment II* and the note directly above concerning active volunteers.
- A description of the education activities including content, method, frequency, and evaluation of effectiveness:

Most educational activities are done upon request. These include informational sessions for Iowa Lions Clubs, training sessions for Iowa Lions Club Volunteers, participation in health fairs, and informational meetings with different interest groups. An annual meeting for Iowa KidSight Coordinators and Trainers is also an educational activity. Following are the detailed descriptions of each.

Informational sessions for Iowa Lions Clubs (~ 2 per month): Lions Clubs request guest speakers to visit their Clubs to conduct informational sessions on Iowa KidSight. The speaker is most often the Program Coordinator or Lion District Coordinator. The content describes what the Program is, who carries it out, how it is carried out, why it is carried out, Program progress, and also provides time for questions and discussion. The information is delivered depending on the Club's request, e.g., PowerPoint presentation, viewing of informational video, lecture/handouts. Evaluation of effectiveness could be measured by the Club's further decision to support or participate in the Program.

Training sessions for Iowa Lions Club Volunteers (~ 3 per month): Lions Clubs who decide to adopt Iowa KidSight as a community service project request training sessions to become certified to screen. A board-certified Orthoptist from the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences "trains the Trainers." There are 25 Iowa Lions Club volunteers who have assumed the role of Trainer throughout the state. The content of the training sessions includes specific instructions on the processes involved in conducting screening sessions, hands-on practice with the PhotoScreener, and practice and testing on what makes an interpretable screening photograph. Trainers use PowerPoint presentations that include this content, and also provide those being trained with a typed Training and Review Packet for taking home. The Packet outlines screening roles and processes, step-by-step. Once the ~three-hour training session is complete, each participant is asked to complete an Evaluation Sheet which is used to monitor the effectiveness of the training session/Trainer.

Participation in Health Fairs (~12 annually): Lions Clubs will decide to participate or receive requests to participate in health fairs (or County Fairs) in their local communities. Sometimes screenings are offered if the location of the fair is conducive. If not conducive for screening, informational brochures and handouts on why screenings are necessary and how to request one are handed out. Evaluation of effectiveness could be measured by how many screenings are conducted as a result of the educational material being distributed. Vision screenings and educational information are also extended during the lowa State Fair each year.

<u>Informational meetings with different interest groups (~6 annually)</u>: The majority of these round-table meetings are requested by collaborators. Content includes information on how lowa KidSight is carried out, how screening sessions can be requested, and how programs can work together. Evaluation of effectiveness could be measured by resulting collaborative efforts and/or further screenings being conducted.

Annual Meeting of KidSight Coordinators and Trainers: The content of these educational sessions include updating volunteer leaders on Program methodologies, Program progress, collaborative efforts, and discussing current situations at-hand. These annual round-table meetings are mandatory for those volunteers assuming leadership roles. Participants are asked to evaluate the content of each meeting on a Communication Sheet that they utilize throughout the meeting. These meeting were once conducted bi-annually but due to recent budget cuts they are currently held on an annual basis.

 Description of the mechanism for assuring that the list of eye doctors contains current referral information:

The Iowa KidSight office receives annual lists of membership from the Iowa Academy of Ophthalmology and the Iowa Optometric Association. These lists are compared with previous listings of Iowa eye care professionals and updates are incorporated into a database maintained by Iowa KidSight office staff. Additionally, each Referral List contains a note indicating that Iowa KidSight appreciates receiving updates and corrections, and provides contact information to do so.

This fiscal year we incorporated a "welcome letter" to new providers. The letter describes how the lowa KidSight program is carried out and it also describes the importance of returning the Evaluation Sheet to the KidSight office after exams are conducted as the result of a vision-screening referral.

 Documentation of the measures taken to assure that AEAs, Head Start Programs, WIC Clinics and elementary schools receive information regarding coordination and integration of services provided:

The scheduling of vision screenings is done at the local level by Iowa Lions Club volunteers. Screening sessions are primarily held in childcare settings and might also be held in a public location and advertised to the public. Lions Clubs collaborate with their neighbors who are employees of AEAs, Head Start Programs, WIC Clinics and elementary schools to coordinate and schedule collaborative screening activities locally. Collaborative screening sessions conducted in 2011-2012: 70-AEA, 27-WIC, 270-Head Start, 38-Kindergarten Roundups.

- In my capacity as Program Manager, I assure that 100% of Iowa Community Empowerment Programs were sent a letter detailing:
  - a. A description of how free vision-screening sessions are conducted,
  - b. How to request a screening,
  - c. Ways Iowa KidSight can keep Community Empowerment areas informed of screening activity in local areas.
- In my capacity as Program Manager, I assure that 100% of AEAs, Head Start Programs, WIC Clinics and elementary schools\* receive information regarding coordination and integration of services.
- \* Elementary schools are only served upon particular request as this age group is not part of the lowa KidSight target population. Most all screening activity done in elementary schools is done in conjunctions with kindergarten round-up events.

"We found out my son had severe amblyopia in December 2011 due to your program and probably would not have realized it until it was too late for treatment."


