RSVP

- The commission is responsible for determining a maximum funding allowance per volunteer for RSVP projects receiving state funding. It was determined that the funding limit set for Fiscal Year 2016 (\$300 per volunteer) had been set too low and should have been closer to \$350. Commission voted to raise allowance to a maximum of \$350 per volunteer and issued a retroactive waiver for Fiscal Year 2016 target to allow all RSVP programs to receive full FY17 allocation. Also, new grants in Monroe and Wapello counties, Jefferson County, Pottawattamie and Mills counties, and in South Central lowa were awarded an automatic five-year waiver effective through Fiscal Year 2020 to provide adequate time to develop a fully functional RSVP program.
- A state appropriation of \$279,000 for RSVP (Retired Senior Volunteer Program) Grants, will leverage over \$1.2 million in federal funds and support 5,498 RSVP Senior Corps Volunteers. Grants were approved to the following entities:
