Re: 2016 Annual Report of the Iowa Tobacco Use Prevention and Control Commission

Pursuant to Iowa Code section 142A.4, I am pleased to submit to you this annual report of the Iowa Tobacco Use Prevention and Control Commission for 2016. The Commission and our community partners take seriously the challenge of reducing the negative impacts of tobacco use among Iowans. We appreciate the support you and other leaders have shown in the important tobacco reduction goals of our commission.

The intent of the legislative charge for Iowa's tobacco use prevention and control initiatives, as outlined in Iowa Code chapter 142A, are summarized below:

- 1) To establish partnerships among the Executive Branch, General Assembly, communities and the people of Iowa in addressing the prevalence of tobacco use in the state;
- 2) To work toward reduction in tobacco use by youth and pregnant women, while also engaging youth actively in attainment of these results; and
- 3) To foster a social and legal climate in which tobacco use becomes undesirable and unacceptable.

Tobacco use is the leading cause of preventable death in Iowa and the United States. Consider the following statistics:

- Nationally, more than 480,000 people die each year from their own cigarette smoking or exposure to second-hand smoke.
- 5,100 Iowa adults die each year from their own smoking.
- 1,500 Iowa youth become daily smokers each year.
- 18.1 percent of 11th grade students use tobacco.

2016 accomplishments of the Tobacco Use Prevention and Control Commission, and the IDPH Tobacco Division include:

- Local tobacco control work taking place in all 99 counties.
- As of November, 2016, 284 Iowa school districts have adopted a voluntary tobacco and nicotine-free policy.
- As of November, 2016, there are 366 tobacco free-parks in Iowa.
- 935 rental properties in Iowa have enacted a voluntary-smoke free policy.

In 2016, the Tobacco Use Prevention and Control Commission recommend state policymakers focus on the following priorities:

- Obtain adequate funding and staff to implement strategies stated in the 2014-2018 Strategic Plan.
- Create a process/system to collect data on tobacco control efforts.
- Create consistency in policy, practice, education and messaging to all policymakers and stakeholders.

- MR 1 Goal 1: Choice between Tobacco Free and Nicotine Free (TF/NF) policy change programming for either parks, K-12 schools, preschools/daycare centers; or colleges/universities/community colleges/trade schools.
- MR 2 Goal 2: Choice between TF/NF worksite wellness policies or community events policies.
- MR 3 Goal 3: Clinics/health practitioners that adopt the Ask, Advise & Refer fax referral system.
- MR 4: Coalition Development (such as increasing coalition membership or number of meetings per quarter).
