The statewide mass notification and emergency messaging system, known as Alert Iowa, began deploying during FY 2015. HSEMD selected a vendor via the competitive bid process and awarded a contract. That contract is with Inspiron Logisitics and has an annual cost of \$294,500 for the next three years.

As of November 1, 2016, 89 counties have signed up to use Alert lowa. Presently 80 are live on the system with the remaining 9 actively engaged in the deployment process. In the last year, Alert lowa was used by the participating counties to issues in excess of 9,000 alerts that generated over 3,600,000 unique messages. The types of alerts counties have been sending include but are not limited to road closures, boil orders, missing children, significant public safety events, dispatching emergency responders, emergency responder personnel recalls, emergency exercises/drills and NOAA Weather Alerts. Additionally the system was used by HSEMD and IDALS to support the response to Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza.
