



IOWA DESIGN CAPACITY COMPARED TO INMATE CUSTODY LEVEL SCORES JULY 1, 2009



IOWA DESIGN CAPACITY COMPARED TO INMATE ASSIGNMENTS JULY 1, 2009



- Custody scores are used in determining the security level based on the likelihood toward violence, escapes, adjustment to prison life, and the need to control the inmate's behavior. In specific cases, the Department may determine that an individual needs a different security level than shown by the custody score.
- Comparing the inmates by custody score with design capacity shows that there is a shortfall of 895 minimum-security beds.
- Comparing inmate assignments to design capacity shows that there are 192 more inmates than beds for minimum-security facilities.
