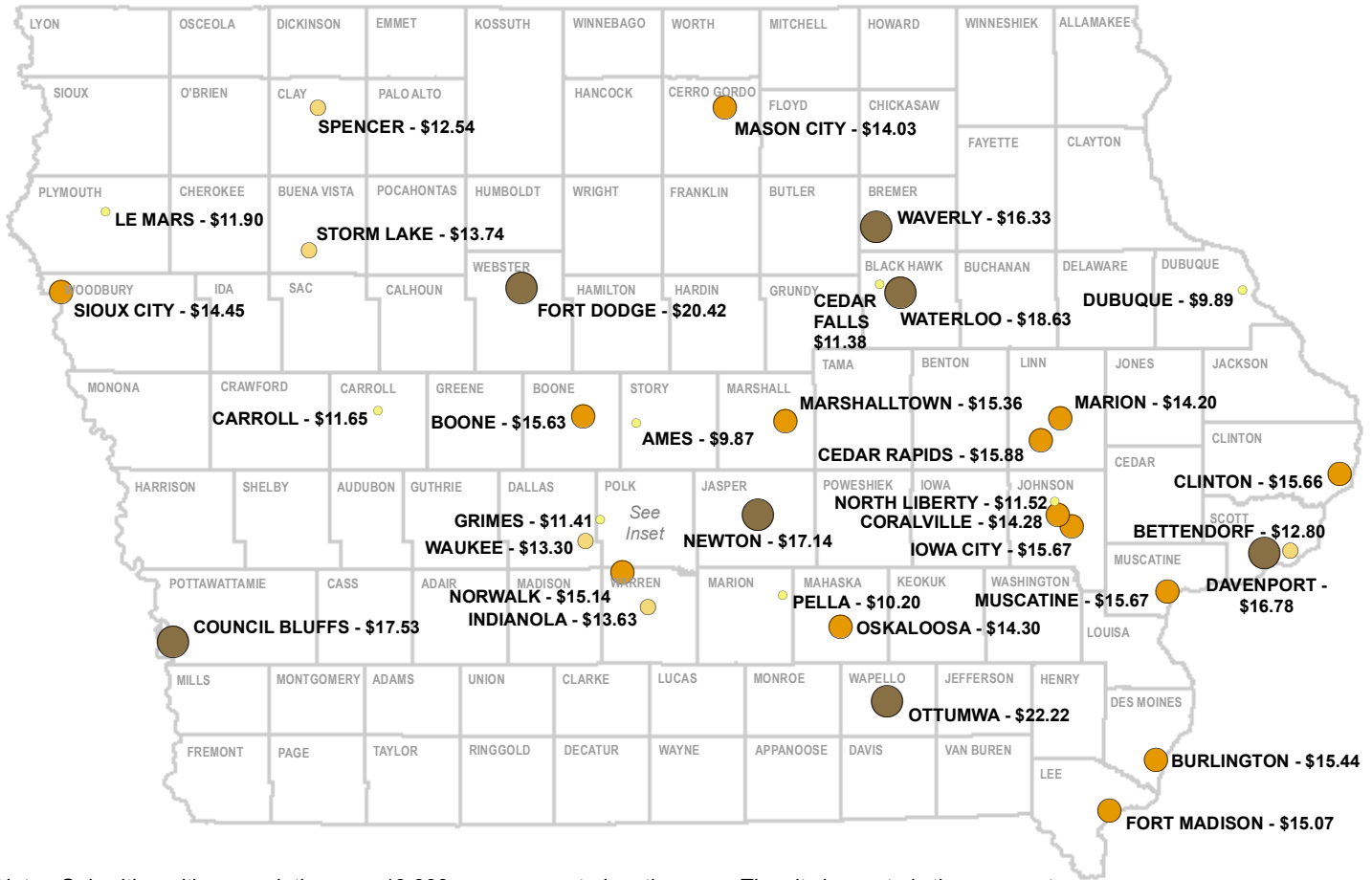


City Property Tax Levy Rates — FY 2022

Levy Rates for Cities Over 10,000 Population



Note: Only cities with a population over 10,000 are represented on the map. The city levy rate is the aggregate rate levied for city budget purposes and includes levies for the general fund, the emergency fund, debt service, trust and agency funds (includes pensions and related employee benefit funds), capital improvements, and emergency funds. The statewide average excludes urban agricultural property value, Tax Increment Financing (TIF) value, and property that is taxable but made exempt from the city tax levy.

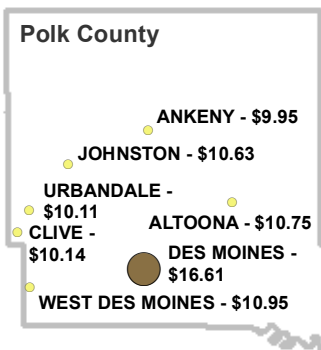
