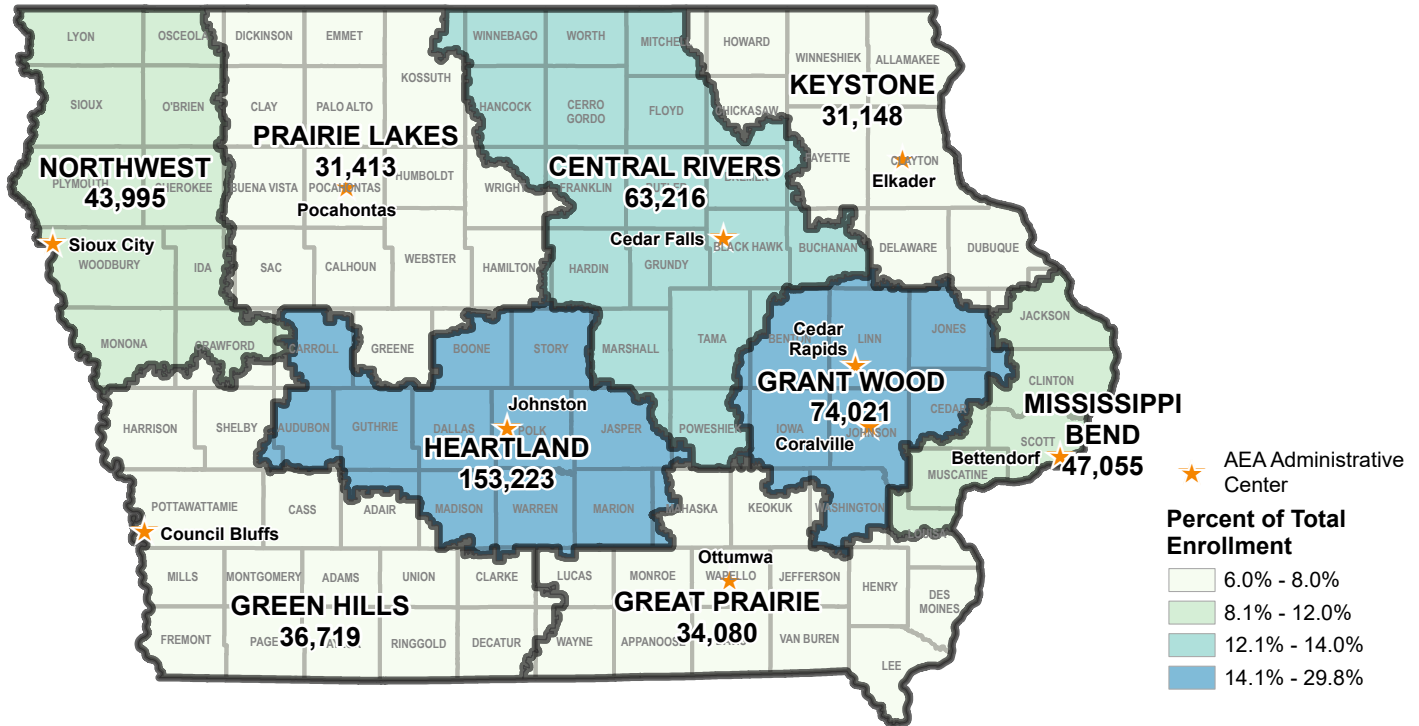


Enrollment Served by Area Education Agencies (AEAs)

Iowa's nine Area Education Agencies (AEAs) provide educational equity across the State, working as educational partners with public and nonpublic schools to improve learning outcomes and child well-being. AEAs provide services and regulatory responsibility in three main areas: special education, media and technology services, and educational services (the majority of which is curriculum development). AEAs are funded through the school aid formula, and funding is generated at the school district level using the same basic formula: cost per pupil times enrollment. Each AEA has a separate cost per pupil for each of the three service areas.
