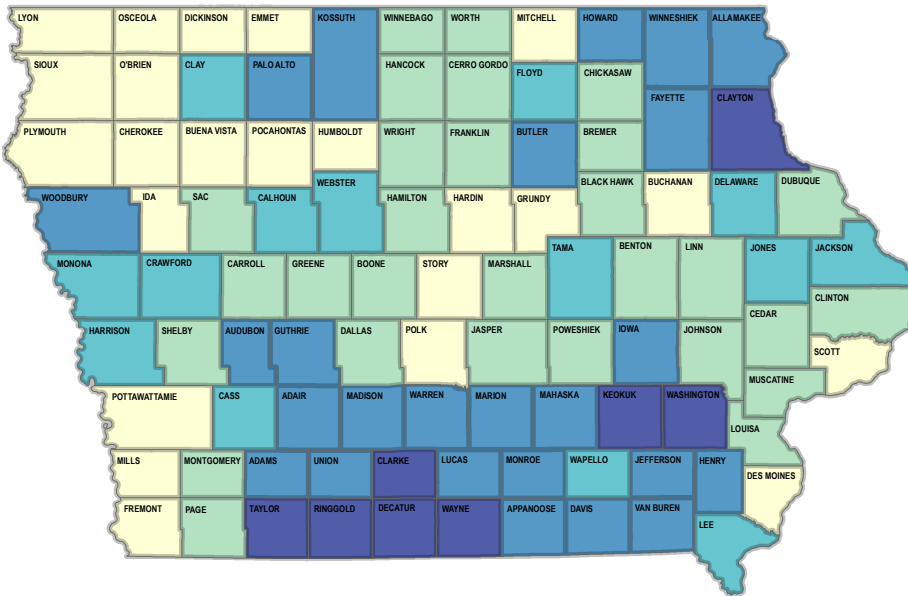


# Acres Enrolled in the Conservation Reserve Program – FFY 2016

The Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) is a land conservation program administered by the Farm Service Agency (FSA). In exchange for a yearly rental payment, farmers enrolled in the Program agree to remove environmentally sensitive land from agricultural production and plant species that will improve environmental health and quality. Contracts for land enrolled in CRP are 10-15 years in length. The long-term goal of the Program is to reestablish valuable land cover to help improve water quality, prevent soil erosion, and reduce loss of wildlife habitat by planting native grasslands and long-term ground cover plants so wildlife populations can redevelop, as the plants provide places for nesting as well as winter cover.



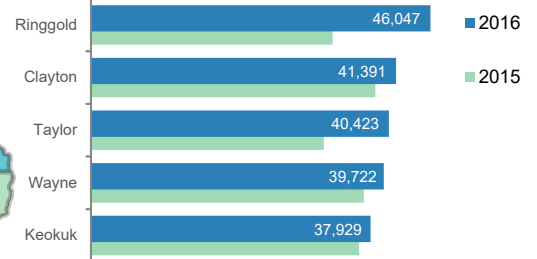
Enrollment of Acres in Iowa

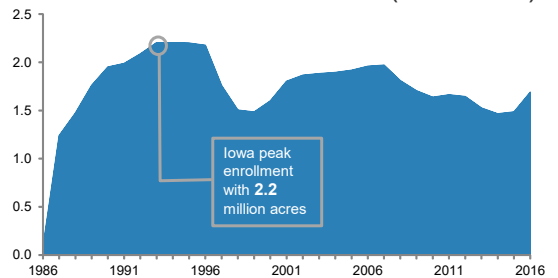

### Highest Five Counties

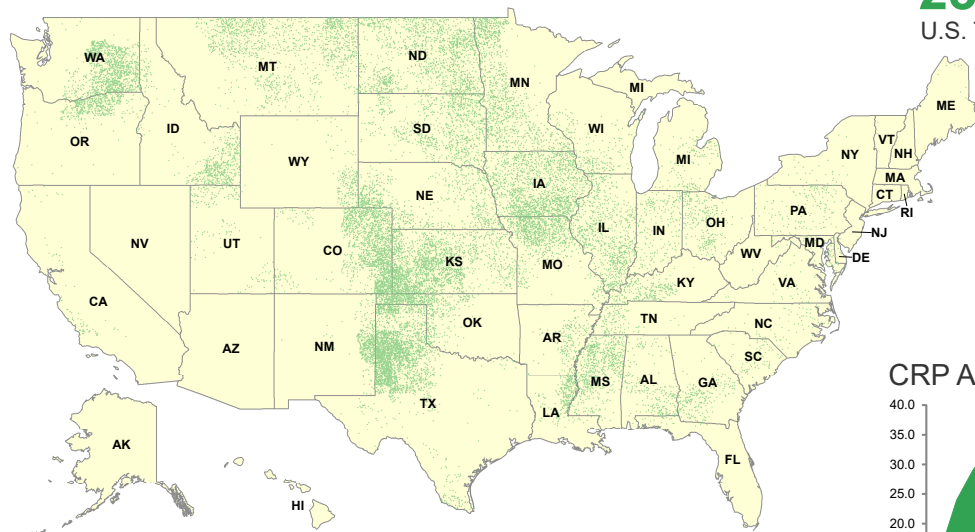


### CRP Acres Enrolled in Iowa (in millions)



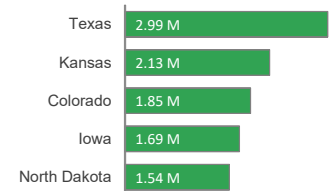

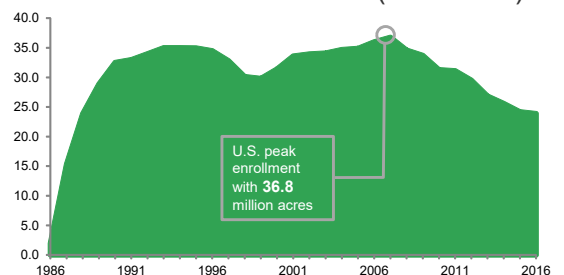


Enrollment of Acres in U.S.
