



SF 18 – Certificate of Need Elimination, Health Facilities (LSB1634XS)
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Fiscal Note Version – New

Description

[Senate File 18](#) eliminates the certificate of need (CON) process required prior to the offering or development of a new or changed institutional health service and makes conforming changes throughout the Iowa Code.

Background

Certificate of Need is a regulatory review process that requires application to the [Department of Public Health](#) (DPH) for, and receipt of, an approval prior to the offering or development of a new or changed institutional health service. Potential applicants include hospitals, nursing homes, outpatient surgery centers, or anyone purchasing medical equipment valued above \$1.5 million. Projects proposed by providers are reviewed by DPH staff and the five-member State Health Facilities Council against the criteria specified in Iowa Code section [135.64](#).

The fees required to be paid with an application are equivalent to 0.3% of the anticipated project cost, with a minimum of \$600 and a maximum of \$21,000 ([641 IAC 202.4](#)). These fees are deposited in the General Fund. An application for a new or changed institutional health service offered or developed by an intermediate care facility for persons with an intellectual disability or mental illness is exempt from the fee.

Assumptions

- For FY 2017 and FY 2018, fee revenue deposited in the General Fund averaged \$123,000.
- The DPH staff, council expenditures, and program costs necessary to operate the process are funded through the [Public Protection](#) General Fund appropriation. The estimated FY 2019 budget is \$132,000.

Fiscal Impact

[Senate File 18](#) would decrease General Fund fee revenue by an estimated \$123,000 in FY 2020 and each year thereafter.

[Senate File 18](#) would decrease the DPH staff by 1.0 full-time equivalent (FTE) position and would decrease expenditures of the Public Protection General Fund appropriation by \$132,000 beginning in FY 2020 and each year thereafter.
