Description

House File 503 adds a Medicaid buy-in provision for individuals under 19 years of age with disabilities whose family income or resources are at or below 300 percent of the federal poverty level. The Bill also charges a premium to families between 100 and 300 percent of the federal poverty level (FPL). The Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 allows States to give Medicaid eligibility to children who meet the Social Security Administration standards for disability but also exceed the related eligibility limits for income or resources.

Assumptions

- An additional 93 children would become eligible for Medicaid in FY 2008, rising to 137 in FY 2009.
- The monthly cost for eligible children is \$940.
- An estimated 25.0% of participants would be assessed a premium with an average premium of \$43. The premium cannot be more than 5.0% of family income for families with incomes between 100% and 200% of FPL and not more than 7.5% of family income for families with incomes from 200% through 300% of the FPL.
- Because changes would not be able to be implemented until September 2007, there would be only 10 months of eligibility in FY 2008.
- A total of 1,550 hours at a rate of \$75 an hour would be required to make changes to the computer system.
- The State share of the Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) for FY 2008 is 38.21%.

Fiscal Impact

House File 503 is estimated to be a net decrease to the General Fund of \$386,000 in FY 2008 and \$583,000 in FY 2009.
