## **Environment First Fund**

The 2000 General Assembly established the Environment First Fund in SF 2453 (FY 2001 Infrastructure Appropriations Act) to provide funding for protection, conservation, enhancement, and improvement of natural resources and established a standing appropriation of \$35.0 million for the Fund beginning in FY 2001 from the Rebuild Iowa Infrastructure Fund (RIIF). The funding levels have fluctuated over the years. The standing appropriation was changed to \$42.0 million for FY 2014. See funding details below followed by a brief description of major programs.

## **Description of Major Programs**

Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program – provides funds for wetlands development.

Conservation Reserve Program - provides financial incentives to landowners.

Watershed Protection Program – provides funds to target water quality problems.

Soil Conservation Cost Share Program - provides funds for permanent soil and water conservation practices.

Farm Management Demonstration Program – demonstration of crop and livestock management techniques.

<u>Alternative Drainage System Fund</u> – provides cost-share funds to assist landowners with the closure of agriculture drainage wells.

Loess Hills Development and Conservation Fund – provides funds to stabilize stream channels and preserve the Loess Hills.

Southern lowa Conservation and Development Authority – provides funds to stabilize stream channels and prevent soil erosion.

Resource Enhancement and Protection Fund (REAP) - as specified in statute.

State Park Operations and Maintenance – maintenance and related activities.

Water Quality Protection Fund – administers the federal Safe Drinking Water Act.

Water Quantity Program - provides information on water usage.

Ambient Air Quality Monitoring Program – monitors air quality.

Animal Feeding Operations Program - provides oversight, technical assistance, and enforcement.

**Resource Conservation and Development Program** – provides funds to local resource conservation and development groups when a dollar-to-dollar match is provided.

Keep lowa Beautiful – provides funding for the Hometown Pride Program that will hire community coaches to provide technical assistance to selected counties and communities to implement cultural vitality, infrastructure, image, and sustainability plans.

Brownfields Development Program - provides funds to clean contaminated commercial sites.
