




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FY 2014 Performance of Duty Expenditures

The purpose of the Performance of Duty appropriation is to provide funding for emergency repairs to state property, if sufficient funds are not available in a state agency budget. The appropriation can also be used to fund a portion of the local match for local governmental entities in areas where presidential disasters have been declared. All expenditures from the Performance of Duty appropriation must be approved by the Executive Council. The Performance of Duty appropriation is a standing unlimited appropriation from the state's Economic Emergency Fund. A standing unlimited appropriation means there is no limit to the amount of expenses that can be approved by the Executive Council. Prior to FY 2012, the standing unlimited appropriation was funded through the General Fund, although other sources were occasionally used in place of the General Fund.

During FY 2014, a total of \$15.8 million was expended through the Performance of Duty appropriation. This was significantly lower than the \$34.0 million that was included in the FY 2014 budget. Of the total \$15.8 million in expenses, 87.4% (\$13.8 million) was directed to the Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management to cover costs associated with natural disasters dating back to 2008.

Performance of Duty is a difficult appropriation to budget for because the funds are generally used to respond to emergency situations. This is illustrated in the chart below that compares the amount budgeted to the actual year-end expenses for the past 10 years. The table on pages 2 and 3 provide additional detail on the expenditure of the FY 2014 funds by state agency.
