Fred L. Koogler, 66, of 2304 Ridgeway Ave., died 7/22 at New Sharon Care Center. He was born Dec. 22, 1925 at Wright to Liston A. and Fern Smith Koogler. He married Edna Marantha Rowe on Jan. 10, 1948 at Oskaloosa. He graduated from Oskaloosa High School, where he earned 12 athletic letters, in 1944. He was inducted into the Army Air Force and served during World War II and the Korean and Vietnam wars, retiring in March 1970 and moving back to Oskaloosa.

He then served as district director of Boy Scouts of America, then as executive director of the Oskaloosa YMCA. In 1973, he was elected to the Iowa House of Representatives and served District 91 for two terms, 1974-1978. He was a member of the Democratic Party. He then worked at Clow Corporation until 1987, then retired due to poor health. He was a member of the First Christian Church. He was on the Mahaska County Conservation Board and the Bloomfield Cemetery Board, a scoutmaster, and a coach for Pop Warner Football. He was a member of Council Lodge 644, A.F. & A.M., and the American Legion, Harry L. Anderson Post No. 34. As the first mayor of Keomah Village, he was instrumental in incorporating the town.

He is survived by his wife, Edna of Oskaloosa; a son and daughter-in-law, Fred, Jr. and Jane of Pella; a daughter and son-in-law, Nancy E. and Gary Ferber of Greenfield; three granddaughters, Tracy and Genny Koogler of Pella and Jessica Ferber of Greenfield; and two sisters, Ruth Newell of Rose Hill and Maxine Holm of Sigourney. He was preceded in death by his parents and a brother, Donald LeRoy Koogler.
