LEGISLATOR CAFFREY DIES

Services for State Representative James T. Caffrey, 67, of 2312 S.W. Twelfth St., will be at 10 a.m. Thursday at St. Anthony's Catholic Church. Burial will be at Glendale Cemetery.

Mr. Caffrey was dead on arrival at a Chicago, Ill., hospital Saturday after he suffered a heart attack in his hotel room earlier. He was in Chicago to attend a meeting of the Council of State Governments.

Mr. Caffrey, a Democrat, was serving his fifth term in the Iowa House of Representatives. He had announced earlier that he would be a candidate for reelection in District 67, which includes the south side of Des Moines.

Mr. Caffrey was born in New York City and moved to Des Moines in 1943. He was employed by Firestone Tire and Rubber Co. from 1945 until his retirement in 1974.

He was also president of United Rubber Workers union Local 310 for various periods totaling more than 12 years, was vice-president of the South Central Iowa Federation of Labor, AFL-CIO, for six years and was a member of the United Rubber Workers international executive board for four years.

Mr. Caffrey was a member of the Knights of Columbus Council 644, the Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus of Dowling General Assembly, the Dowling Club and the St. Anthony's Holy Name Society. He served on the Appropriations Committee, the Human Resources Committee and the Labor and Industrial Relations Committee in the Iowa House.

Survivors include his wife, Veronica; two daughters, Veronica Zenti of Des Moines and Velda Sansaverino of West Norwalk, Conn.; a brother, Al of New Milford, N.J.; a sister, Rosemary Moran of Berryville, N.Y., and seven grandchildren.

Notice is hereby given that there are now on file in the Office of the Iowa Natural Resources Council, James W. Grimes Building, Des Moines, Iowa, applications for permits to withdraw water for highway construction as herein described. The water will be withdrawn from any stream or watercourse on the right of way of the road being constructed, and roads within one mile of the road being constructed, and from additional sources as noted.

AUDUBON COUNTY
AUDUBON COUNTY requests a permit to withdraw water in the maximum quantity of 600,000 gallons at a maximum rate of 120,000 gallons per day during the period May 15 to October 31, 1976. The water will be used in construction on M66 from NW corner of Section 5, T79N, R34W, north 4.25 miles to the SW 1/4 of Section 8, T80N, R34W, Audubon County, Iowa. The additional source of water for this project is Indian Creek in the SW 1/4 of Section 20, T79N, R34W, Audubon County, Iowa.

BLACK HAWK COUNTY
BLACK HAWK COUNTY requests a permit to withdraw water in the maximum amount of 500,000 gallons at a maximum rate of 50,000 gallons a day during the period April 19 to November 15, 1976. The water will be used in highway construction in the S 1/2 of Section 10, T88N, R12W, and along the north line of the NE 1/4 of Section 27, and the NW 1/4 of Section 26, T88N, R13W, and from the N 1/4 corner of Section 34 east 2.5 miles to the NE corner of Section 36, T87N, R13W, Black Hawk County, Iowa. Sealed proposals for supplying 62,500 tons of stocker coal to the University of Iowa, Iowa City, Iowa, will be received by the University of Iowa at the office of the Physical Plant Department, 103 W. Burlington St., University of Iowa, Iowa City, Iowa, up to 2:00 p.m., May 11, 1976, and then will be publicly opened and read.

Copies of the specifications and other contract documents are on file in the Physical Plant Office at the University of Iowa and are available for public inspection. A set of such documents may be obtained from the Physical Plant Office, 103 W. Burlington St., University of Iowa, Iowa City, Iowa.

Each proposal must be accompanied by a cash deposit, certified check or a bid bond in an amount of at least 2% of the total bid on 62,500 tons, based on maximum mine prices. Check shall be made payable to the order of the University of Iowa. Should the successful bidder fail or neglect to furnish a satisfactory surety bond, refuse to make a contract on the basis of his bid, or fail to meet the requirements of this notice and the specifications regulating the award, his cash deposit, certified check or bid bond may be forfeited as liquidated damages. No bidder may withdraw his proposal for a period of thirty days after the date set for the opening of bids.

By virtue of statutory authority, a preference will be given to coal produced within the State of Iowa.

No bid may be withdrawn within thirty days from the scheduled closing time for receiving bids.

Proposals may be opened by the University of Iowa at any time or at any place and to waive any irregularities therein.
