Harold Fischer Services Held

Harold O. Fischer was born on August 4, 1917 in Wellsburg the son of John L. and Grace Huisman Fischer. He passed away on December 15 at 9:35 a.m. of cancer at the Grundy County Memorial Hospital in Grundy Center.

Harold attended the Wellsburg Public School and graduated in 1935. Following graduation from high school, he attended the University of Northern Iowa and the American Institute of Business in Des Moines. After graduation from AIB, he worked briefly in the bank in West Bend. He returned to Des Moines where he was employed by LOOK magazine until 1940 when he was transferred to New York City.

In 1941, he returned to Iowa where he volunteered for military service and was inducted on June 30, 1941. After serving one year with the 3rd Armored Division, he entered Officers Candidate School at Fort Knox, treams and no Kentucky. Upon completion of that training, he was assigned to the 4th Armored Division in Pine Camp, New York. The 4th Armored Division later landed on Omaha Beach in France and participated in five major military campaigns prior to the end of the war.
