Former representative dies

Charles F. Strothman, 83, New London, a former Iowa Legislature representative, died at 7:21 a.m. Monday, May 27, 1985, at University Hospitals, Iowa City.

Born June 11, 1901, near Danville, he was the son of Charles A. and . Parma Obermann Strothman. He married Doris Maxwell June 11, 1929, at Crawfordsville.

A graduate of Burlington High School, Mr. Strothman attended Iowa State University. He served in the House of Representatives in the Iowa Legislature from 1963 to 1974. While in the Legislature, he served as chairman of the House Agriculture Committee.

Mr. Strothman was engaged in farming, livestock feeding and breeding of Polled Hereford cattle. He served as president of the school board, New London Farmers Coop, Henry County Farm Bureau, 4-H. Club Committe and served on the New London State Bank, church and livestock boards as well as Republican precinct and congressional committeeman.

A past president of the Southeast Iowa Hereford Association and Henry County Livestock Feeders, Mr. Strothman also was a member of the Farm Bureau, American and American Polled Hereford Associations and Iowa Cattleman's Association and the United Methodist Church.

Surviving are his wife; three daughters, Mrs. Carol Messer, Yarmouth; Mrs. Charlotte Young, North Liberty; and Mrs. Charlene Larson, Stevens Point, Wis.; three sons, Charles (Max), Marion; Fredric and John, both of New London; 19 grandchildren; seven great-grandchildren; and one sister, Mrs. Hallie Gehring, Burlington.

Three sisters and two grandsons preceded him in death.

Lyle R. Stephens was born June 23, 1911 in Aurora, South Dakota, the son of Roy and Ella Stephens. On September 1, 1938 he married Marie Borchers, to which union twin daughters and one son were born.

A graduate of Le Mars High School, he attended Western Union (Westmar) College. Mr. Stephens owned and operated a 600 acre grain livestock farm until 1966. 


