## FIRE MEETING SET THURSDAY

### Trustees to Attend Talks on Protection In Outlying Areas

Fifteen township trustees in areas surrounding Iowa City are being invited to attend a meeting here to discuss fire protection in rural areas.

The meeting, approved by the city council this week, has been called for 7:30 p.m. next Thursday, February 23. The session will be held in City hall.

Attending, in addition to the township trustees, will be city officials, including Fire Chief Al Dolezal, Mayor Preston Koser, members of the city council, and City Attorney W. H. Bartley.

The city clerk is writing to the township trustees to notify them of the forthcoming meeting.

The question of whether or not the Iowa City fire department shall give protection to homes and towns outside the city has been under study for two years. An ordinance, providing for contracts with outlying areas, has been given three readings in the council. Passage, however, has been postponed until after the meeting with township and other government groups.

## Paul W. Schmidt, 63, Former State Senator, Dies Today

Paul W. Schmidt, 63, lifelong Iowa Citian and former state senator, died at 4:30 a. m. today in his home at 930 East College street after an illness of more than a year.

Mr. Schmidt was born here June 29, 1886, the son of George W. and Augusta Schmidt, pioneer Iowa City residents.

He was a graduate of St. Mary's high school and attended the University of Iowa and Purdue university in Indiana.

For a number of years he was associated with his father in the ownership and management of the Iowa City Iron and Construction Co., which was sold to the Putnam interests.

Mr. Schmidt served as a Democratic member of the state senate in 1932-36 and was instrumental in formation of the Iowa highway patrol.

He served as exalted ruler of the Iowa City Elks organization in 1915 and for a time as president of the Iowa Elks association. He also served as deputy of the Elks' southeast Iowa district.

Mr. Schmidt was a charter member of Marquette council, Knights of Columbus, here. The council's records also list him as

He was a member of the Holy Name society of St. Mary's church here and was affiliated with the Chicago Athletic club. He was a member of the old Iowa City Alert Hose company. During World War II he was engaged in national defense work in Des Moines with the Solar Aircraft Corp.

Mr. Schmidt was married June 4, 1913, in Iowa City to Laura M. Englert, who survives him. Also surviving are a son, Donald W., Iowa City; a daughter, Mrs. Joyce Dixon, and a grandson, Jeffrey Craig Dixon, both of Norfolk, Va. His parents preceded him in death.

Funeral services will be held at 9 a.m. Thursday at St. Mary's church, with burial in St. Joseph's cemetery. The rosary will be recited at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday at the McGovern funeral home.

## FREDERICK C. SCHADT

MR. PRESIDENT: Your committee, appointed to prepare suitable resolutions commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable Frederick C. Schadt, begs leave to submit the following:

Frederick C. Schadt was born March 27, 1885, and reared at Amana, Iowa, son of Conrad Schadt. He took his college work at the State University of Iowa in professional and liberal arts colleges. His extra training in medicine was mostly in surgery and surgical diagnosis, and he holds the degrees of Ph.C., M.S., and M.D. He practiced medicine thirty years.

He was married to Miss Louise Setzer of Amana, Iowa, and to this union was born one son, Conrad F.

Dr. Schadt was author of treatises on government, economics, and sociology in general. He was also a member of state political science, historical, economists and sociologists associations, and the American Political Science Association, as well as a member of county and state medical societies. He was a member of the Masonic, Knights of Pythias, Odd Fellows, and Elks fraternities, and a past member of the local board of education. He was elected to the Senate in 1936 and served in the Forty-seventh and Forty-eighth General Assemblies. He died at the age of 65 on December 12, 1950.

*Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Fifty-fourth General Assembly:* That in the passing of the Honorable Frederick C. Schadt, the state has lost a valuable and honored citizen and the Senate would tender by this resolution its sincere sympathy to the surviving members of his family, and
