Obituaries

Ivor W. Stanley

Ivor W. Stanley, 68, of Decorah, died Friday, March 12, 1993, at the Winneshiek County Memorial Hospital of an apparent heart attack.

Memorial services were Thursday, March 18, at 2:30 p.m. at Grace Episcopal Church in Decorah, with the Rev. George F. Wharton, vicar, officiating. Burial will be at a later date at Arlington National Cemetery in Arlington, Va.

French & Balik Funeral Home of Decorah was in charge of arrangements. Organist was Marjorie Wharton.

He was born in Newton, Oct. 28, 1924. He graduated from Newton High School in 1942 and attended the University of Iowa in Iowa City and Drake University in Des Moines. He served with distinction in the U.S. Army on active duty for four years and 18 years in the reserve. Overseas twice, he was wounded three times and was a prisoner of war.

He holds three Purple Hearts, the Silver Star, the Bronze Star, and five campaign ribbons. He was a major in the retired reserve.

He was an Internal Revenue Agent from 1947 to 1952, when he was founder of Iowa Midland Supply Inc., a Cedar Rapids industrial distributor, where he was secretary-treasurer. He also was vice president and director of Farmers Savings Bank in Walford, and treasurer and director of the Strawberry Valley Development company of Ash Flat, Ark.

He was past president of the Cedar Rapids Optimist Club, past president of the Linn County I Club, board member

of University Athletic Club in Iowa City, chair of the Iowa Merit Commission in Des Moines and president of the Iowan's for Right to Work in Des Moines.

He was former Linn County state representative from District 45 from 1972 to 1974.

An avid sports fan, he was a member of the Football Writers of America, and wrote sports features for the Cedar Rapids Gazette and other newspapers. He also participated in football radio broadcasts for KCRG radio.

He served five years on the Kids League Baseball Board and two years as director of the Cedar Rapids Sports Club.

He was past vice president of the Eastern Iowa Industrial Distributors Association.

He was a member of the Cedar Rapids Board of Adjustment, American Legion, Executive Club, Elks Club, ACBL, and El Kahir Shrine.

He was a member of St. Michael's Episcopal Church, where he was a vestryman, treasurer, junior warden and senior warden. In 1965, he was named outstanding layman of the year in that church.

He and his wife, Ruth, were married in 1948.

He moved to Decorah in 1984, and was an active member of Grace Episcopal Church.

He is survived by his three children, Nancy, Maxwell of Alexandria, Va.; David of Decorah; and Ann Stanley of Minneapolis, Minn.

Hiller Holien

Hiller Holien, 96, of Ossian, died March 10, 1993, at the Chosen Valley Care Center in Chatfield, Minn., and formerly of St. Charles and Whalan, Minn.

Funeral services were held Saturday, March 13, at 1:30 p.m. at the Whalan Lutheran Church, Whalan, Minn., with the Rev. Byron Meline, officiating. Burial was at the church cemetery. Pallbearers were his grandsons, Carl Ladenburg, Rick Thorson, Jeff Holien, Scott Holien, David Hanson Jr., Thor Thorson, Jim Holien and Craig Hanson. Hoff Funeral Home of St. Charles, Minn., was in charge of arrangements.

Hiller Holien was born July 4, 1896, the son of Halver and Siri (Sandvik) Holien July 4, 1896, in Winneshiek County. He married Elsie Wiedow July 25, 1928, at the Little Brown Church in Nashua. They lived in Ossian before moving to Minnesota in 1945. While living in Whalan, they owned and operated Holien's Groceries for 19 years. Mr.

Holien served as mayor of Whalan from 1967 to 1970, and was instrumental in starting the Whalan softball diamond and had been a baseball player. He and his wife moved to St. Charles, Minn., in 1971. Mrs. Holien died May 26, 1987.

Survivors include two sons, Hiller Jr. of Minnesota, Minn., and Robert Holien of Peterson, Minn.; five daughters, Vivian (Mrs. Bill) Ramlo of Tacoma, Wash., Irene Ladenburg of Columbia Falls, Mont., Ione Thorson and Marlyn (Mrs. John) Hanson, both of Chatfield, Minn., and JoAnne (Mrs. David) Hanson of St. Charles, Minn.; 30 grandchildren; 37 great-grandchildren; and two sisters, Bea Lansing of New Hampton and Elsie Gordon of Charles City.

Preceding him in death were his parents; five brothers, Seval, Orlando, Melvin, Henry and one in infancy; six sisters, Hilda Johnson, Ida Gullickson, Martha Holzer, Esther Schroeder, Louise Thompson and Gladys Faber; and one grandson.
