

Benjamin Franklin Swangel was born in Carroll county, Ohio, March 12, 1835. He came to Montezuma in 1855, and in the year 1858 married Eliza J. Saunders. He enlisted in Company C, Twenty-eighth lowa volunteers, August 2, 1862. He was in the battle of Champion's Hill, Twenty-eighth Iowa Volunteers, August and carried a buck-shot in his breast which he received on that field as long as he lived. He was in the siege of Vicksburg, the Red River campaigns, under Gen. Banks, and many battles and skirmishes. The names of his children are: William W., Frank, Aaron, Charlotte and Christopher. Mr. Swangel was an industrious and faithful man, with a good, honest reputation among those with whom he deals. Benjamin passed away in April 30, 1914.




