## Civic Leader Dies

Lynn Battles, 68, a former cattle feeder and civic leader was found dead at his rural farm home Wednesday when a neighbor became concerned about him. Battles, well known in farming and livestock circles, was a former state representative.

Battles was a consistent supporter of the cattle industry and was instrumental in gaining property tax relief for cattlemen with repeal of the tax on cattle while in the legislature.

The retired farmer was a cattle feeder for many years at his feedlot operation southwest of Maquoketa. Battles also served as president of

the Jackson County Farm Bureau and was a member of the county fair board.

He was a director of the Maquoketa State Bank at the time of his death and was an early supporter of the bank when it was established in the 1950's.

Battles' surviving son, Gary, of Scott City, Kan., said Friday that one of his father's major interests continued to be 4-H work in the county.

Lynn Battles served for a number of years as a leader of the South Fork Stockman 4-H Club and aided in achievement show work.

The funeral for Lynn F. Battles, Sr., 68, R. R. No. 1 Maquoketa will be held today, Saturday, Jan. 27 at 1:30 p.m. at the Haylock-O'Hara Funeral Home in Maquoketa. Mr. Battles died Wednesday, Jan. 24 at his home. Visitation was held Friday, Jan. 26 from 2 to 5 p.m. and 7 to 9 p.m. Burial will be in the Union Cemetery with the Rev. Delbert Dawes of the First United Methodist Church, Maquoketa, officiating.

Lynn F. Battles, Sr. was born Dec. 14, 1910 in Haynes, N.D. to Dana C. and Maloa Taubman Battles. He married Dorothy Helen Gisel on Dec. 14, 1937 in Davenport. He was a retired farmer, a member of the State

Legislature as a Representative from this area from 1966 to 1970. He was a member of the Methodist Church in Elwood, director of the Maquoketa State Bank, a member of the Jackson County Fairboard and a past president of the Jackson County Farm Bureau.

Survivors include his wife, his parents, Maquoketa, one son, Gary O. Battles, Scott City, Kan., six grandchildren, three sisters, Mrs. Robert (Anna) Serbousek, Anamosa, Mrs. Darrell (Helen) Reichling, Maquoketa and Mrs. Doris C. Miller, Rock Island.
