PRESBYTERIAN DISCORD TOLD

MASSANETTA SPRINGS, VA. (AP) — Disagreement surfaced Monday between the new leadership of the Presbyterian Church in the U.S. and its critics over whether the denomination is destined to break apart.

"I do not see our church going into schism," said the Rev. Dr. Ben Lacy Rosa of Richmond, Va., its newly elected moderator. But he added that a projected North-South Presbyterian reunion could cause minor defection.

To stem the divisive tendencies, he appealed for wider latitude for differences.

"We've got to learn to live with diversity all the way across the board," he told a news conference.

On the other hand, Kenneth S. Keyes of Miami, Fla., head of an independent organization of laymen opposing current church trends, told newsmen: "Eventually there's got to be division, a break in the church."

If North-South unification comes, Keyes estimated a third of the southern church's million members will refuse to go along with it. He said the split possibly could come later this year over more immediate issues.

"Some sort of realignment is inevitable," said Keyes, a millionaire real estate man and president of Concerned Presbyterians, Inc.
