### Plan Memorial Service For Les Kluever

A memorial service for Lester Luverne Kluever, 69, longtime Atlantic attorney and former state legislature, will be held at 11 a.m. Thursday at the First United. Presbyterian Church, with the Rev. Michael McDowell officiating.

Interment of the cremains, will be at the Atlantic Cemetery at a later

Mr. Kluever died Monday at his home. He donated his body to the University of Iowa for scientific purposes.

The son of Emil C. and Louise Lilienthal Kluever, he was born on a farm near Atlantic Feb. 29, 1920. and graduated from the Atlantic High School in 1938

. He attended the University of Jowa and on Dec. 7, 1941, he entered the Army Air Force, wherehe served until February 1946.

Mr. Kluever was a captain in the 407th Air Squadron in the 92nd Bomb Group of the 8th Air Force. He served in Europe and was shot down over Kiel, Germany, May 14, 1943 and was a prisoner of war in

Germany until April 29, 1945. He was awarded the Purple Heart July 28, 1945, the Good Conduct Medal, American Defense Service Medal and several campaign medals, including European, African, Mid Fast and America and the Silver

Mr. Kluever then returned to the University of Jowa, where he received a bachelor of science degree in business administration and accounting in 1947 and a juris doctor's degree in 1950 from the University of Iowa Law School, He had been a member of the Sigma Nu and Delta Sigma Pr fraternities at the university.

His marriage to Gwyn Hughes of Sac City took place at the First Presbyterian Church in Iowa City May 19, 1947, and they moved to Atlantic in 1950 when he started practicing law, His wife died in 1980 and he continued his law practice here. He was a member of the firm of Kluever, Van Ginkel & Van Ginkel.

He had been a member of various law organizations and had served as Cass County attorney for several years, served seven terms in the lowa Legislature from 1956 to 1970, had been a member of the Rotary, Shriners, 14ks Lodge, Masonic Lodge, American Legion, Veterans of Torreign Wars, American Veterans, was president of the Atlantic YMCA in 1961 and 1962 and a life member of the University of Jowa afumur association. He also served in a number of other organizations and was a member of the List United Presbyterian Cloud for

## U.S.Troops Bunker Con PeaceTalks

DHAHRAN, Saudi Arabia (AP) Diplomatic efforts redoubled today in a bid to avert a land war, but the pace of combat north of the Saudi border also accelerated. In one clash, U.S. forces said they smashed an Iraqi bunker complex and captured hundreds of prisoners

Italy, which is part of the allied coalition confronting Iraq, endorsed a Soviet peace proposal today and isclosed some of its details

The Soviets asked that the plan remain private until Iraqi Foreign Minister Tariq Aziz delivered his government's response. President Bush has indicated the Soviet plan is unacceptable.

While the diplomatic wheels spun, preparations for a major ground offensive continued with some of the heaviest border skirmishes of the Gulf War.

In one such clash this morning one American soldier was killed and seven wounded, according to a U.S. command spokesman in Riyadh, Marine Brig, Gen. Richard I. Neal U.S. forces took seven Iraqi prisoners in that fight, Neal said

Elsewhere north of the Saudi border, Neal said, U.S. helicopters attacked an Iraqi bunker complex at about 2 p.m. today, destroying 13-to 15 bunkers and taking 450 to 500 prisoners of war. Neal said huge Chinook transport helicopters were sent in to pick up the PUN's
