Masonic services conducted by Tom Engleton of the Grand Lodge of Iowa will also be held at that time. Visitation will be Wednesday afternoon and evening at the Adams Funeral Home in Ames.

Mr. Knight died at Oakco Rock Medical Center, Oakco Rock, Ark., on Monday, July 18.

Survivors other than son, Ray, include wife, Fern, Horseshoe Bend, Ark.; sons, Dean, Washington; Kent, Columbia, S.C.; brother, Don of Richardson, Texas; sister, Mrs. Gladys Spangier, Macy; and eight grandchildren.

The old I. Knight was born the son of Christian D. and Mary Owen Knight on February 10, 1841, in Ames. He went to Ames High School, where he was a 1909 graduate, then ~~from~~ from Iowa State University in Ames in 1937. He worked for Anderson-Dickson as a cottage cheese maker following a move to Des Moines in 1937.

He was united in marriage to Fern ~~Wibben~~ on April 7, 1907.

Later, they moved to Humboldt in 1962, where he conducted his own ~~business~~ until Knight's

birth. Mrs. Anna Willett, Algona; Mrs. Rudolph (Bertha) Willett, Burt; Mrs. Louis (Edna) Price, Lakota, and a brother, Carlisle Wibben, Lone Rock.

Albert Wibben was born in Hartsburg, Ill., and attended school there. He moved to the Burt area in 1915 with his parents.

He farmed prior to his marriage in 1929 at Burt to Esther Ah. The couple farmed in the Lakota area, then moved to the Burt-Bancroft area, and lived there until 1961 when they moved to Algona. Mr. Wibben was employed with the Algona Street Department prior to his retirement.

He was also involved in the Masons, by being a member and past master of the Eastern Star Lodge No. 195 in Humboldt Chapter, named and accepted in the Scottish Rites Bodies in Des Moines, of which he also was a 33rd degree mason. He also was a member in both the York Bodies of Fort Dodge and the Za-Ga-Zig Bodies in Des Moines. He also has been a past junior grand steward and grand treasurer of the Grand Lodge of Iowa.

Mr. Knight was a state legislator in 1955-56.
