Due to the death of his mother, at the age of 8 Homer made his home with his cousins, Mr. and Mrs. Homer Townsley.

In his youth, Homer was baptized into the Church of Christ and has been an active member of the Leon congregation.

He completed grade school in Eden Township, Iowa; high school in Harper, KS; and business school in Des Moines, Iowa.

Homer spent most of his life farming. He owned and operated Warren Duro-Gas for 10 years. He served in the 53rd session of the Iowa State Legislature.
