Retired businessman died Saturday

Former State Senator and an area businessman, John L. Buren, died Saturday at his home in Forest City following an illness of several months. He was 77 years old.

Funeral services will be held at 10:30 this Wednesday morning at St. James Catholic Church with Father John R. Kremer officiating. Burial will be in St. James ceme-

Chub," as he was known to all, was elected a state senator in November, 1964, and served a fouryear term representing Winnebago and Hancock counties. He also was Democrat county chairman for six years.

"Chub" was thrust into the business world early in 1933 while a student at Columbia College in Dubuque when his father suffered a stroke and "Chub" had to come home to take over the family grocery business in Leland.
