M.W. 'JACK' BEAMAN

M.W. "Jack" Beaman, the son of William W. and Mary A. Deets Beaman, was born Feb. 18, 1924, in Hopeville, a rural farming community in Clarke County. He died Jan. 9, 1998, at Iowa Methodist Medical Center in Des Moines. He was 73.

He graduated from Murray High School. He was inducted into the U.S. Army at Camp Dodge on March 17, 1943 and was shipped to Fort Lawton, Wash. where he joined the 10th Mountain Division. He transferred to Camp Hale, Colo. and experienced skiing and mountaineering for the first time. He was assigned to Company I, 87th Regiment.

Mr. Beaman was wounded in action April 19, 1945. He was awarded two Battle Stars, a Bronze Star, the Purple Heart and received Combat Infantryman and Good

Conduct Medals.

Mr. Beaman was an Iowa State Trooper from 1949 to 1979 where he progressed to the rank of assistant chief. He was founder of KJJC Radio in Osceola and president and CEO of Helco Manufacturing in Murray.

Mr. Beaman served four terms (1987-1994) in the Iowa House of Representatives and was past-president of the Iowa State Policeman's Association, member of Davis Pence American Legion Post in Osceola Veterans of Foreign Wars, Disabled American Veterans, Purple Heart Association, Evening Star Masonic Lodge, Scottish Rite Temple in Des Moines and the Osceola Rotary Club.

He was preceded in death by his parents and two brothers, Boyd

Beaman in 1919 and Kenneth Beaman in 1995.

Mr. Beaman is survived by his three daughters; Jackie Hoffa and her husband, Chuck Hoffa, of Cumming, Cindy Hamilton and her husband, Monte Hamilton, of Indianola and Jodi Beaman of West Des Moines; six grandchildren, Laura, Sarah, Bryan, Cheryl, Kendra and Bill; a brother, Lloyd Beaman of Highland, Kan.; six sisters, Elma McKay of Highland, Suzie Backer, Louise Simms and Alice Jenkins and her husband Paul Jenkins, all of Hiawatha, Kan., Lucille Franck and her husband, Charles Franck, of Ankeny and Betty McMurphy and her husband, Bob McMurphy, of Garden Grove; as well as many nieces and nephews and a host of friends.

Services were held at First Christian Church in Osceola where Mr. Beaman was member at 1:30 p.m. on Jan. 13 with the Rev. Fred Rohlfs officiating. Eulogies were given by Larry VanWerden and Gary Kimes. Organist Belva White accompanied Mike Raeberg as he sang The Old

Rugged Cross and What a Wonderful World.
