



Former state lawmaker remembered for service

martiey native served in Iowa House for 10 years

HARTLEY-Ingwer "Ing" Hansen, a lifelong Hartley resident who spent a decade in the Iowa House of Representatives, died Monday at the Senior Wellness Center in Hartley. He was 87.

Hansen, who served in the House 1972-82, rose to become assistant majority

Hansen also was a member of the board of directors of Village Northwest Unlimited in Sheldon, president of the O'Brien County Board of Education and an original member of the Community Memorial Hospital in Hartley. In addition, he served on the Northwest Iowa Community College Board of Directors and was president of the college founda-

"Ing was one of those individuals who approaches things very practically," said Carl Rolf, NCC president. "He had a lot of experience to draw on so he was an asset to the board and the foundation."

According to Rolf, Hansen's experience and clear thinking made him an asset in all his public service.

"He was just an individual who had a lot to give," he said.

Hansen was a rural mail carrier for 42 years before he retired in 1972. After his time with the Iowa Legislature he enrolled at Worthington Community College and received his associate degree

with highest honors.

Funeral services for Hansen were Thursday. He is survived by a son, Ingwer "Orv" Hansen Jr. of Sheldon and two daughters, Mary Ann and her husband Kenneth Gregory of Dysart and Jane and her husband Ronald Kauzlarich of LeMars.

He was also secretary of the Chamber of Commerce for 33 years and a lifetime member. He also was on the board of directors of Village Northwest in Sheldon; the Iowa Department of Aging Beer and Liquor Control Commission, board of directors at Northwest Iowa Community College in Sheldon president of the NCC Foundation. For 10 years he was in the House of Representatives from northwest lowa and had served as assistant majority leader. Following this, he attended Worthington Community College and received his associate degree with highest honors.
