Paul Craig, 84

Paul E. Craig, 84, of Tempe, Ariz., formerly of Marshalltown, died Aug. 26, 2005.

Funeral services will be 11 a.m. Saturday at the Iowa Veterans Home Chapel. Services will also be held in Tempe, Ariz.

He was born Dec. 29, 1920, in the Reinbeck area, to William and Golda Walker Craig and graduated from Reinbeck High School. He married Betty Krivohlavy in 1950. Paul served in the U.S. Navy from 1941 to 1945 and was active in WWII. In 1965-66, he was a state representative for Marshall County. He retired from the Northwestern Bell Telephone Company.

He is survived by his wife Betty, his son Steven (Sue) Craig of Tempe, Ariz. and daughter Cathy (Darrell) Braack of Marshalltown; brother Myron (Nancy) Craig of Reinbeck, sister-in-law Bernice Craig of Dike; four grandchildren, three great-grandchildren, and several nieces and nephews.

Paris buildings recently hit by deadly fires, it home to dozens of Africans, many of whom were illegal immigrants.

Firefighters said several people, including four children, died in Monday night's fire, the third since April 1997 in buildings housing foreigners in the French capital.

Among the dead was a 10-year-old boy whose mother threw him out of a fifth-floor window to try to save him from the flames, police said. The bodies of the mother, who was pregnant, and her child, who was 3, were found in the building.

On the same floor, firefighters found a second victim: a woman, who was pregnant with twins, her husband and their two children, said.

Two other people were seriously injured in the fire, which ripped through a six-story building in Paris.

Eleven people, including five firefighters, had injuries.

Police said they believe the blaze was accidental, starting in a kitchen inside.

Residents had fled the building after a power outage from a nearby building.
