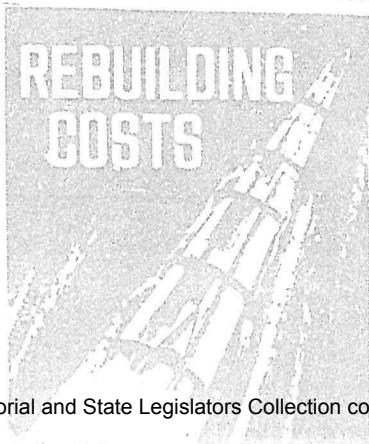
county. She resided in Iowa and Johnson counties most of her life.
