One operator of the company, James Leroy Kemmish, was arrested in 1994 by customs agents when he was returning from overseas.

"Simply shutting down Overseas Mail wasn't enough, because those who created the demand for child pornography were still out there," Hunter said.

The post office took over the business after Kemmish was arrested, changing its name to Island Mail and running it as an undercover operation, he said.

White Hou travel offic

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Clinton today invoked executive privilege in refusing to Congress remaining documents related to the White House office firings, prompting 11 Republicans to move forward a contempt of Congress vote.

"The President has directed me to inform you that he invokes executive privilege, as a protective matter," White House counsel Jack Quinn wrote the House Government Reform and Oversight Committee.

Quinn's letter left open the possibility that after further review some documents the White House is withholding may be released.

The letter drew a response from the committee's chairman.

"Unfortunately, the White House, in keeping with their tradition of secrecy, has decided to withhold from this investigation a vaguely defined body of documents," Rep. William Clinger, Pa., said today.

During the fight over President Nixon's Watergate tapes, the Supreme Court recognized that presidents can invoke executive privilege to prevent the release of Congress documents that deal with private conversations between the president and his aides.

In support of the claim, Quinn released a letter from Attorney General Janet Reno dated
