Hugh Alfred (Al) Meacham Jr., 56, died March 3 of an apparent heart attack in Acapulco, Mexico.

Should friends desire, memorials in Mr. Meacham's name may be made to Grinnell College. His body was willed to medical science.

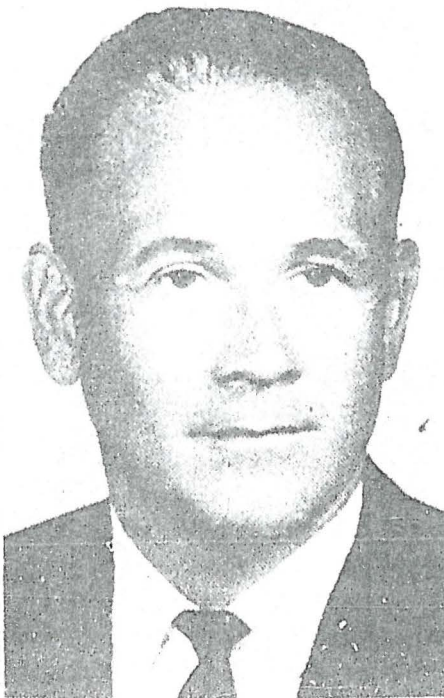
The son of Hugh A. and Hazel Meacham, he was born Aug. 20, 1921, on a farm near Malcom. In 1945, he was married to Lois Clifton. The couple had three children.

Mr. Meacham began farming in partnership with his

father in 1947 in Washington Township south of Grinnell. He was also president of Agri-Service, Inc. He served for 3½ years with the U.S. Navy Air Corps during World War II.

Mr. Meacham was elected to the Iowa House of Representatives in 1964 for a special reapportionment session and the 1965 regular session.

He was a member of the Grinnell Chamber of Commerce, Rotary International, Toastmasters International, and the Eagles Lodge. He served on the Grinnell-Newburg Board of Education from 1962 to 1964. In 1962, he was the Poweshiek County representative to the State Assembly of School Boards. He also served as chairman of the House Commerce Committee while in the Legislature. He was chairman of the Steering Committee and was ranking member of the Sifting Committee. He was a member of the National Rules and Procedure Committee of the National Legislative Conference. He served on the Iowa Development Commission in 1965-66, and was secretary of the Iowa Senate for the 1967 session. On July 1, 1967, he was appointed by Governor Harold Hughes to the Iowa Merit Employment Commission for a six-year term.

JUDGE JOHN F. STONE

Mr. John F. Stone was born in Malcom on March 28, 1918. His parents were Fred T. Stone and his wife, Louise. John was graduated from Malcom High in 1935 and received his B.A. degree from the State University of Iowa in 1939. He was later graduated from the College of Law, State University of Iowa in 1946. He practiced law in Mason City from 1946 to 1963, with the exception of his years of military service. He was in the U.S. Army from Aug. 2, 1941 to Feb. 10, 1946 and again from July 5, 1950 to Oct. 28, 1951.

He married Marjorie Louise Ziegler and they have three children, John, Phillip and Robert.

He served as District Judge of the 12th Judicial District from Jan. 1, 1964 to Dec. 31, 1971 and is now District Judge of the second Judicial District as of Jan. 1, 1972.

HUGH ALFRED MEACHAM, JR.

Hugh Alfred Meacham Jr. was born August 20, 1921, on a farm near Malcom. Iowa. His parents are Hugh and Hazel Meacham he has one sister, Alice Meacham Williams, who now lives near Philadelphia, Pa.

His family farmed near Malcom until 1938, and then moved to a farm three and a half miles south of Grinnell.

"Al" Meacham was graduated from Grinnell High School and Grinnell College. His major subjects were: Psychology and Economics. He served three and a half years in the Navy during World War II and started farming in 1947.

He served on the Grinnell Newburg School Board from 1962-64. and was elected to the Iowa House of Representatives in 1964 for a special reapportionment session and the 1965 regular session. He has served as chairman of Commerce Committee and Steering Committee and as ranking member of Sifting Committee. He also served on National Rules and Procedure Committee of the National Legislative Conference. He served on the Iowa Development Commission 1965 to 1966, and as secretary to the Iowa Senate 1967 session.

On July 1, 1967, he was appointed by Governor Hughes to the Iowa Merit Employment Commission for a six-year term.

He has farmed since 1947, presently farming a 540 acre livestock-grain farm in Washington and Grant townships.

He was married to Lois M. Clifton in 1945, and they have three children, Michael, 24, Casey, 21, and Connie, 18.

Freddie was killed shortly after graduation from Malcom High School. Ray became a medical doctor and practiced in Cedar Rapids until his death in 1968. Verda taught school in Sioux City where she now lives. Mable, also a school teacher, passed away in 1968. Clarence was a business man and died in Dec. of 1962. Francis, a bus driver, lives in Cedar Rapids. Paul, a medical doctor, practices in Cedar Rapids. Orrin and Edna were teachers and live in Cedar Rapids.


LAWRENCE J. VOGEL

Lawrence Vogel was born October 1, 1908, the son of Nick and Elizabeth Vogel in Malcom, Iowa. He attended grade school in seven Sheridan Township. After finishing high school he attended Malcom High from 1924 — 1927 and was Class President in 1927. He was a member in the Malcom Farmers State Bank from 1928. From 1928 till 1932 he attended St. Joseph's College in Davenport. He attended St. Joseph's Seminary at St. Paul, Minn. from 1932 till 1936.

He was ordained to Catholic Priesthood in Davenport Sacred Heart Cathedral on June 1, 1936. In 1936 he became Chaplain at Ft. Penitentiary and associate at St. Joseph in Ft. Madison where he remained until 1941. From 1941 — 1943 he served as associate pastor of Paul The Apostle in Davenport. In 1943 he was Auxiliary U. S. Naval Chaplain in Davenport, Iowa. He served as Pastor of St. Joseph Church in Nichols, Iowa, from 1944 — 1964 he served as Pastor of St. Patrick in Burlington, Iowa until 1966, when he became pastor of St. Alphonsus Church, Mt. Pleasant from 1966 — 1969. He was assigned to St. De Salles Church at Keokuk, Iowa, in 1969. He remains at that post.
