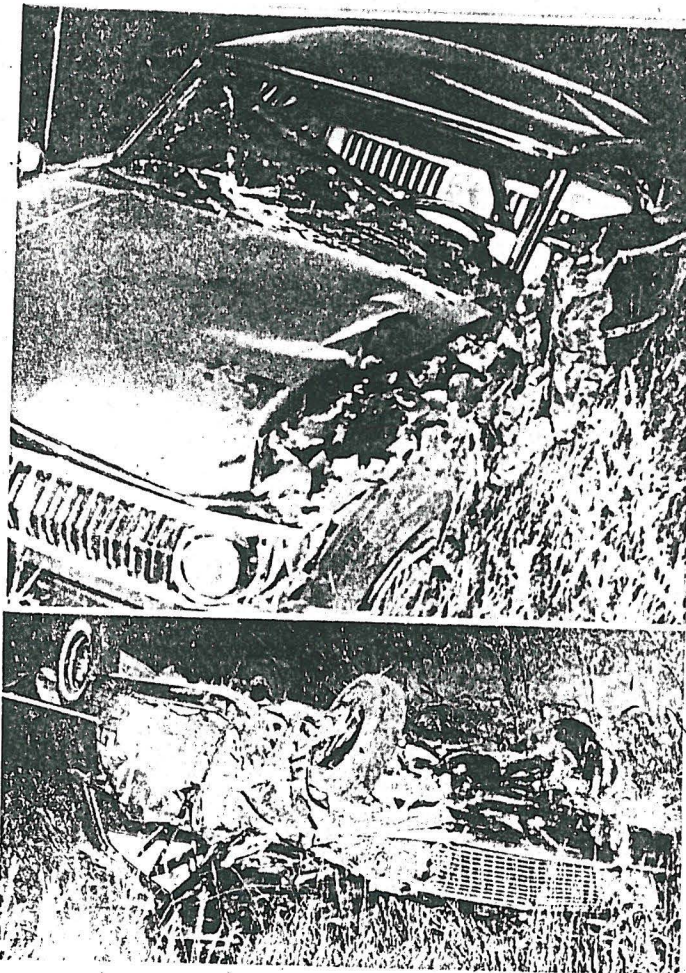

Astronauts Dock With Satel



CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP) — The Gemini 11 astronauts, swift hunters in the sky, accomplished man's quickest rendezvous of high-flying space vehicles today as a dramatic prelude to three adventurous days in space.

They caught and captured an Agena target satellite before they completed their first orbit of the globe.

"We are docked," ex-Gemini 11 command Charles Conrad Jr. said to the spacemen.

"Beautiful," Mission said to the spacemen.

The rendezvous occurred approximately 185 miles above the Pacific Ocean and the work relayed by the pilots who passed over a tracking station at Point Arguello, Calif. Conrad and Navy Lt.

Hughes: High Traffic Toll 'Frustrating'

DES MOINES (AP) — Iowa's high traffic death rate is one of the most frustrating problems he has faced in office, Gov. Harold Hughes said Monday.

"If anybody has any ideas on how to fight it, we would like to hear from them," the governor told a news conference.

Hughes noted the toll — 592 against 510 a year ago — remains high even though the 1965 legislature "passed more highway safety legislation than has been passed at any one session in my lifetime."

He said the State Public Safety Department is studying the record 27 deaths over the Labor Day weekend in attempts to find a solution.

He called for another attempt to enact state requirements of periodic motor vehicle testing and said his administration would give such a bill much higher priority than it did in 1965.

Hughes said such inspections should be made by state-approved private mechanics rather than by state employes.

The governor denied rumors that highway patrolmen might be required to issue a specified quota of tickets.

"I never have approved of a quota system, and I don't believe in it," he said. "If a person deserves a ticket, he should get it regardless of any quota."

Hughes said he also believes drivers should be re-examined periodically to catch those whose physical condition has deteriorated so that they are unsafe drivers and to encourage motorists to keep themselves informed of changes in traffic regulations.

QUESTION: I was injured in an accident 3 months ago and my doctor said it will be at least a year before I can get back to work. What information do I need to file for disability benefits?

ANSWER: We will need your social security card, proof of your age, a listing of your former employers and the names and addresses of the doctors who have treated you for your injury. Do not delay filing if you do not now have all the information. Your social security office may be able to help you get the missing items.

QUESTION: I am a widow who has never worked under social security. I am only 55 years old, but I am unable to work. I was wondering if I could qualify for monthly benefits?

ANSWER: No, you must be at least age 60 to get widow's benefits. Payments cannot be made to you because you are unable to work unless you have previously worked under social security.

Cars involved in Carroll County's 13th highway traffic fatality during 1966 are shown above at the accident site three-quarters of a mile east of Roselle. State Rep. Bernard J. Murphy (D-Carroll), driver of the car shown in top photo, was killed in the crash. The Murphy car is shown in the ditch where it came to a stop on the south side of the road. As shown in photo, the center of impact was just forward of the driver's seat on the left side of vehicle. The car driven by Gary L.

Venteicher, Route 2, Arcadia, is shown below in an upside down position in ditch on north side of road. The Venteicher car had tipped over on one side against a dirt embankment and was rolled into the bottom of the ditch by rescuers after the driver had been removed; investigating officers said. The accident was investigated by Highway Patrolman Larry Long, Carroll, and by Sheriff John G. Longnecker and Deputy Lyle Rungee, both of Carroll.

Services Tuesday for Rep. Murphy

Funeral services are scheduled at 10 a.m. Tuesday at St. Lawrence Church here for State Rep. Bernard J. Murphy, 56, Carroll, who was injured fatally in an automobile accident Saturday night near Roselle.

Mr. Murphy became the county's 13th highway traffic fatality in 1966 when the car he was driving was in a sideswipe collision at 7:55 p.m. with a car driven by Gary L. Venteicher, 25, Route 2, Arcadia, about three-quarters of a mile east of

Roselle on a county black-top road.

The accident happened on the crest of a hill as Mr. Murphy was eastbound and Mr. Venteicher was westbound. The impact shunted the two vehicles into opposite ditches, and a car driven by Edward T. Riesenber, Route 2, Carroll, following the Murphy car, narrowly averted the collision.

Mr. Venteicher was taken to St. Anthony Hospital where he was listed in fair condition Sunday with head injury. See Page 7

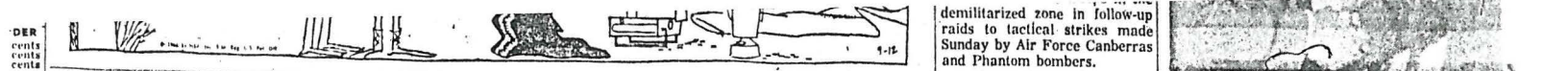

injuries and a dislocated hip. Mr. Murphy was pronounced dead on arrival at the hospital Saturday night.

The 1966 traffic death toll at Carroll county now stands only three under the all-time record set here in 1960 when 16 persons were killed on county highways, Sheriff John G. Longnecker said. Records have been kept since 1948.

The Carroll County legislator was reported to have been returning from a business trip to Halbur at the time of the accident.

Mr. Murphy has served two terms in the state legislature as Carroll County state representative and had won re-nomination on the Democratic ballot in last Tuesday's primary election.

Requiem mass will be celebrated at 10 a. m. Tuesday in St. Lawrence Church by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Henry B. Karhoff. Interment will be in Mt. Olivet Cemetery.

Friends may call at the Sharp Funeral Home after Monday noon. There will be rosaries Monday at 3 p. m.; at 7:30 p. m. by the Knights of Columbus; and at 8 p. m. by St. Lawrence parish. The Elks memorial service will be given at 8:30 p. m. Monday.

Mr. Murphy is survived by his wife and two daughters, Mrs. Bernard (Sue) Feilmeier and Maureen Murphy, all of Carroll; four sisters, Mrs. Lula Maneman and Mrs. Charles (Leone) Daley, Carroll; Mrs. Charles (Ceal) Holland, Denver, Colo.; and Mrs. Irene Heiman, Ashton; and one brother, Frank Murphy of Alameda, Calif. He was preceded in death by four brothers and sisters, Edward, Leonard, Zita and Collette.

He was born Sept. 6, 1910, at Audubon, a son of James and Emma Murphy. When he was two years old the family moved to a farm where the present Murphy home is now located at 1806 Benjamin Street, Carroll.

He graduated from Carroll High School in 1930, and attended Trinity College, Sioux City, two years and Midwest College of Commerce, one year. In 1934 he began work with the R.E.A. Express Company in Carroll and for the past seven years had been manager of the company's office here.

On May 20, 1939, he was married to Dorothy Knippel at Fort Dodge, with the Rev. Robert Joyn performing the ceremony. The couple made their home in Carroll and in 1943, moved to their present home. Mr. Murphy developed the present Murphy Addition in that area which is now a residential section of Carroll.

Mr. Murphy was a member of St. Lawrence parish. He has been active in the Charles Carroll Council Knights of Columbus, of which he was a past grand knight. He served two terms as a trustee, and in 1958 was a state delegate to the national Knights of Columbus convention in Chicago. He also belonged to Elks Lodge No. 1637, the Brotherhood of Railway Clerks, United Travelers Association and the Carroll Chamber of Commerce.

Assault Charge

A U.S. spokesman said American pilots flew a record 171 missions against the Communist North hitting at bridges, fuel depots and transportation facilities in the Hanoi and Halphong areas and the southern Panhandle.

Pilots taking part in Sunday's raids reported damaging or destroying 107 cargo barges, 11 junks, 19 bridges, 33 supply buildings, 13 trucks and one missile site.

Over South Viet Nam, U.S. pilots flew 363 strike sorties Sunday, claiming more than 200 enemy bunkers, tunnels, huts, trenches and fortified positions were destroyed or damaged. A sortie is a single combat mission by a single plane.

Ground action in South Viet Nam continued in a lull and United States and Vietnamese military spokesmen reported no major enemy contacts.

The 171 air missions over the North was well over the previous high of 156 raids of Aug. 26. A U.S. spokesman would not say how many individual plane strikes the 171 missions involved but such large numbers would almost certainly mean 400 to 500 single-plane sorties.

In raids Sunday against the demilitarized zone, Air Force B57 Canberras and F4C Phantoms reported touching off 55 secondary explosions and eight secondary fires.

Communists tried as hard to sabotage anything as they did yesterday," Ky said. "Never before have they failed as yesterday." "This announces the beginning of the end for the Communists," he added. The results, Ky exulted "were beautiful" but he said: "We have not yet, achieved the final victory. There are many obstacles before us and the more we achieve success the more the enemy will redouble his efforts."

"However," he added, "this victory permits us to believe in final victory. We do now have the conditions for final victory." Ky was followed by chief of state Gen. Nguyen Van Thieu.

"The Hanoi regime," Thieu said, will have to have second thoughts about the election they so roundly condemned as a farce."

The election was the first step toward restoring civilian government and it demonstrated that Ky's regime has effective administrative control over the majority of South Viet Nam.

It was a dramatic defeat for the Communists who mounted a campaign of terror in the days preceding the voting and a slap in the face for the once-powerful radical Buddhist minority which had called for a boycott of the polling.

The assembly will have six months to draw up a new constitution after it meets Sept. 26 to replace the one which was abrogated after the overthrow of President Ngo Dinh Diem in 1963.

Second, it demonstrated the ability of the astronauts to use their computer, inertial guidance system and radar to calculate all their maneuvers on board instead of receiving help from ground stations as earlier Gemini hunters did.

The astronauts reported only one minor problem in the rendezvous and docking exercise.

"We had some sort of a funny during rendezvous," Conrad said. "We couldn't switch antennas and on our third correction we had no elevation."

A backup system was used to do the job and after completing the docking, the pilots reported the antenna switching system, used in calculating elevation, was working.

Shortly after docking, Conrad fired the Gemini thruster rockets to push the Agena forward. Purpose of this experiment is to test the technique and accuracy of a direct contact method of determining the weight of an orbiting object - in this case the Agena.

The ground knows the precise Agena weight and officials want to see if instruments aboard Gemini 11 can come up with the same figure during the test.

As Gemini 11 moved in for rendezvous, Conrad said: "I believe I'll go ahead and brake. 1.4 miles. Three-quarters of a mile. Half a mile range right now. 400 feet. Okay, quarter of a mile."

"I've got 'em right here," Conrad said as Gemini 11 neared California.

The Gemini 11 astronauts first reported sighting the speeding Agena as they passed over a tracking station at Tananarive, Malagasy Republic, an island off the east coast of Africa.

Conrad steered the spaceship and Gordon calculated maneuvers with a compact computer as Gemini 11 closed in on the target.

By the time Gemini 11 reached Australia, the distance between the two vehicles had been narrowed to about 20 miles. At this point, Conrad pitched the nose of Gemini 11 up and fired a large burst of power from his spacecraft thrusters.

This increased the spacecraft speed by about 96 miles an hour and put it on a collision course with the Agena.

"You're looking very good," the ground told the pilots. "You're go for 16 dash 1."

This meant that ground calculations showed systems aboard the spacecraft was good for at least 15 orbits. The term "16 dash one" refers to a landing area in the prime recovery zone in the Atlantic east of Cape Kennedy.

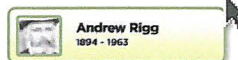

Sept 12, 1966 - Carroll Daily Times - Funeral services are scheduled at 10 a.m. Tuesday at St. Lawrence Church here for State Rep. Bernard J. Murphy, 56, Carroll, who was injured fatally in an automobile accident Saturday night near Roselle. Mr. Murphy became the county's 13th highway traffic fatality in 1966 when the car he was driving was in a sideswipe collision at 7:55 p.m. with a car driven by Gary L. Venteicher, 25, Route 2, Arcadia, about three quarters of a mile east of Roselle on a county black-top road.

The accident happened on the crest of a hill as Mr. Murphy was eastbound and Mr. Venteicher was westbound. The impact shunted the two vehicles into opposite ditches, and a car driven by Edward T. Riesenber, Route 3, Carroll, following the Murphy car, narrowly averted the collision. Mr. Venteicher was taken to St. Anthony Hospital where he was listed in fair condition Sunday with head injuries and a dislocated hip. Mr. Murphy was pronounced dead on arrival at the hospital Saturday night. The 1966 traffic death toll at Carroll county now stands only three under the all-time record set here in 1960 when 16 persons were killed on county highways, Sheriff John G. Longnecker said. Records have been kept since 1948.

The Carroll County legislator was reported to have been returning from a business trip to Halbur at the time of the accident. Mr. Murphy has served two terms in the state legislature as Carroll County state representative and had won renomination on the Democratic ballot in last Tuesday's primary election. Requiem mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Tuesday in St. Lawrence Church by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Henry B. Karhoff. Interment will be in Mt. Olivet Cemetery. Friends may call at the Sharp Funeral Home after Monday noon. There will be rosaries Monday at 3 p.m.; at 7:30 p.m. by the Knights of Columbus; and at 8 p.m. by St. Lawrence parish. The Elks memorial service will be given at 8:30 p.m. Monday.

Mr. Murphy is survived by his wife and two daughters: Mrs. Bernard (Sue) Feilmeier and Maureen Murphy, all of Carroll; four sisters, Mrs. Lula Maneman and Mrs. Charles (Leone) Daley, Carroll; Mrs. Charles (Ceal) Holland, Denver, Colo.; and Mrs. Irene Heiman, Ashton; and one brother, Frank Murphy of Alameda,

Calif. He was preceded in death by four brothers and sisters, Edward, Leonard, Zita and Collette.

He was born Sept. 6, 1910, at Audubon, a son of James and Emma Murphy. When he was two years old the family moved to a farm where the present Murphy home is now located at 1806 Benjamin Street, Carroll. He graduated from Carroll High School in 1930, and attended Trinity College, Sioux City, two years and Midwest College of Commerce, one year. In 1934 he began work with the R.E.A. Express Company in Carroll and for the past seven years had been manager of the company's office here.

On May 20, 1939, he was married to Dorothy Knippel at Fort Dodge, with the Rev. Robert Joynt performing the ceremony. The couple made their home in Carroll and in 1943, moved to their present home. Mr. Murphy developed the present Murphy Addition in that area which is now a residential section of Carroll.

Mr. Murphy was a member of St. Lawrence parish. He has been active in the Charles Carroll Council Knights of Columbus, of which he was a past grand knight. He served two terms as a trustee, and in 1958 was a state delegate to the national Knights of Columbus convention in Chicago. He also belonged to Elks Lodge No. 1637, the Brotherhood of Railway Clerks, United Travelers Association and the Carroll Chamber of Commerce.

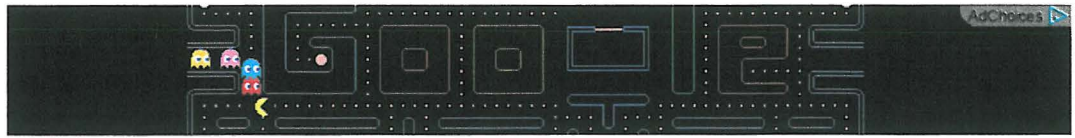
