Mrs. Wolcott of Rockwell Dies

ROCKWELL, IA. — Mrs. Milton H. Wolcott, 63, of rural Rockwell, former Democratic state representative from Cerro Gordo County, died late Wednesday in a Mason City hospital.

She was the first woman legislator from Cerro Gordo County, and served as a representative from 1964 to 1966.

Services are pending at the Patterson-James Funeral Home in Mason City. Surviving are her husband, two daughters, a brother and four sisters.

Representative Paul G. Rogers (Dem., Fla.), acting chairman of the House Commerce Subcommittee, which is considering TV safety legislation, said a survey by the Pinellas County Health Department in Florida revealed excessive radiation in 18 of 110 color sets tested. He said the 18 sets included ones manufactured by General Electric, Philco, Westinghouse and Zenith.

Radiation Hazards

The subcommittee is considering legislation which would require PHS regulation of all equipment that carries radiation hazards.

Terrill said the PHS survey showed that several models were emitting radiation in amounts in excess of levels recommended by the National Committee on Radiation Protection and Measurements.

He said that only in a few cases were there high levels of the excessive radiation. The
