J. Louis Fisher, 78, Osceola, died Sunday, April 19, 1987 at the Iowa Methodist Medical Center in Des Moines.

Services were held Wednesday, April 22 at Kale Funeral Home in Osceola. The Rev. Clifford Haider officiated at the 11 a.m. services. Interment was in Maple Hill Cemetery in Osceola.

J. Louis Fisher was born December 12, 1908 in Decatur County. Son of Harry R. Fisher and Jessie Hanner Fisher, he was a graduate of Van Wert High School. He obtained a B.A. degree from Simpson College in 1933, and did graduate work at Drake University. On August 3, 1933, he married Audra Lynn. One child was born to this union.

Fisher was a former coach and teacher at Osceola High School from 1941-43. He was the owner of Fisher Firestone for 20 years and served as an Iowa State Senator from 1952 to 1960. He was a member of Osceola Lodge No. 77 A.F. and A.M., and was a lieutenant in the United States Navy during World War II from 1943 to 1945. He was also a member of the Osceola United Methodist Church.

Survivors include his wife, Audra of Osceola; one son, Harry Fisher and wife, Betty of Des Moines; one sister, Willa Palmer of Albuquerque, New Mexico; two granddaughters, Lori Riley of Colorado Springs, Colorado and Linda Van Hoever of Des Moines; three great grandchildren, Kari and Nicole Van Hoever and Megan Riley.

He was preceded in death by his parents and one sister in infancy.
