Frances Glichrist Hakes

Frances Helsell Gilchrist Hakes was born February 13. 1897, the oldest daughter of the late Congressman Fred Gilchrist Sr. and Ellen Hurley Gilchrist, Mrs. Hakes was a 1911 graduate of Laurens High School and a 1915 graduate of the University of Iowa. While attending the University of lowa, she was a member of Alpha Xi Delta Sorority: Following graduation, she taught school in Renwick, Sibley, Des Moines and Laurens. In 1922, she married Ledgard B. Hakes following his return home from World War I.

A believer in civic duty, Mrs. Hakes was a member and served as president of the Laurens School Board. She

was elected to two terms, 1960 and 1964, in the Iowa House of Representatives. She served years on the Laurens Public Library Board and was a member of the Daughters of the American Revolu-Womens Progressive Club, Federated Woman's Club and Stitchers. Mrs. Hakes was also a Grand Officer in the Order of Eastern Star and a state president and national vice president of the American Legion Women's Auxiliary. Her proudest moment was during the Laurens Centennial when she served as Grand Marshall of the Centennial parade.

Frances G. Hakes is survived by a son, Ledgard, four grandchildren, Robert Stewart of West Des Moines, Craig Stewart of Gig Harbor, Washington, Tod Hakes and Anne Hakes of La Jolla, California, five great-grandchildren, a brother, Fred G. Gilchrist of Laurens and a sister, Mavis G. Allen of Okoboji.

She was preceded in death by her husband and her daughter, Eloise Hakes Stewart on December 19, 1988.


