Joseph G. Knock, Creston

Services for Joseph G. Knock, 77, 1100 Orchard Drive, will be 10:30 a.m. Thursday at the First Presbyterian Church in Creston.

He died Aug. 22, 1994, at Greater Community Hospital.

The Rev. Lynn Williams will officiate the service. Burial will be in Graceland Cemetery. There is open visitation from 7 to 8 p.m. tonight. The Coen-Beaty Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements. Memorials may be directed to the Crestland Community Betterment Foundation for the community center building.

Mr. Knock was born Oct. 9, 1916, in Grundy County to Eilert and Alice (Hinrichs) Knock. He graduated from Grundy Center High School, then from Iowa State University in 1940. He was employed by the Farm Security Administration in Creston until enlisting in the U.S. Coast Guard in May 1942. In January 1943, he was commissioned as an ensign in the U.S. Navy, serving in the Atlantic and Pacific Theatres of war and discharged as Lt. Sr. Grade in 1945.

He married Rachael S. Emerson

in Creston April 20, 1943. Mr. Knock returned to Creston in 1949 as farm representative for Iowa State Savings Bank. He had been serving as chairman of the board for the past two years, and was president from 1953 to 1993. He was a member of BPOE No. 605, Crest City Lodge 522 AF & AM, ZaGaZig Shrine Temple, Bluegrass Shrine Club, Scottish Rite Masons, Alpha Gamma Roe, American Legion, VFW, Order of the Knoll, Creston Rotary Club, Crestmoor Golf Club, the Iowa State Banking Board for eight years, and First Presbyterian Church.

Mr. Knock served as state representative from 1960 to 1964.

He is survived by his wife, Rachael S. Knock of Creston; two sons, Joseph R. (wife Patricia) Knock of New York, N.Y. and Karl W. (wife Jan) Knock of Creston; daughter, Barbara A. Brandel (husband Steve) Spreter of Tucson, Ariz.; and six grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents; brother, the Rev. H. Calvin Knock; and daughter Gretchen in infancy.
