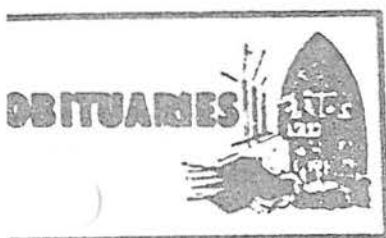

Cecil V. Lutz, 75, of 1204 Scott
Street, Trenton, Missouri, a
former Iowa Legislator who had
made his home in Trenton for the
past two years, passed away
June 26 at 4 o'clock a.m. at
Wright Memorial Hospital,
Trenton, where he had been a
patient for three days.

Services were conducted June
28 at 1:30 p.m. at the Wesley
United Methodist Church in
Trenton with the Rev. Dan
Evans, pastor, officiating.

Pallbearers were Marion Siglin
of Lucas, Harry Blakely, Guy
Reed, Harold Bonnett and Gerald
Patterson, all of Osceola and
Edward Holt of Trenton,
Missouri.

Burial was in the family lot at
the Resthaven Memorial Gar-
dens Cemetery, Trenton,
Missouri. Funeral arrangements
were under the direction of the
Blackmore-Whitaker Funeral
Home.

Mr. Lutz was born March 10,
1901, at New Philadelphia,
Illinois, the son of Cyrus and
Laura Kimball Lutz. He was first
married to Dorella Ballow who
died in 1937. On March 7, 1939,
Mr. Lutz was again married at
Indianola, Iowa to Nelle Black-
more, who survives. Following
this marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Lutz
farmed in Clarke County, Iowa
near Osceola until three years
ago when they moved to Eldon,
Missouri. They had made their
home in Trenton for the last two
years.

Mr. Lutz attended Simpson
College at Indianola, where he
was a member of the Alpha Tau
Omega fraternity. For more than
20 years, Mr. Lutz was a 4-H
leader for boys. He served as a
Representative in the Iowa State
Legislature for three and a half
terms. He was a member of the
Wesley United Methodist Church,
Trenton.
