Sokol, former state representative, dies

Howard Sokol, a former state representative from Osceola County, died on Saturday, January 2, at his home in Iowa City.

Sokol, age 86, was a former owner of Sibley Concrete Products and Shell Lumber in Sibley. He spent 28 years in the building materials and concrete products business.

He served as a flight instructor during World War II, and as an American Red Cross Field Director in Germany.

After leaving the construction business, Sokol graduated from the College of Law at the University of Iowa in 1967. He spent two years as an assistant to the dean, and served the Iowa Senate as Legislative Counsel. He returned to the University of Iowa to serve as vice president of Academic Affairs, and

later worked as director of security before retiring in 1977. He also served as an assistant Johnson County attorney in the criminal division.

Sokol was also active in several volunteer activities.

Survivors include three children: Robert of Port Townsend, WA; Betsie Brown of Churdan, and Sally Brown of Churdan; 10 grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Ruth, and by his parents, Agnes and George Sokol of Sibley.

A memorial service will be held in the spring, and burial will be in the family plot in Sibley. Memorials may be made to Alzheimer's cancer, or heart disease research organizations.

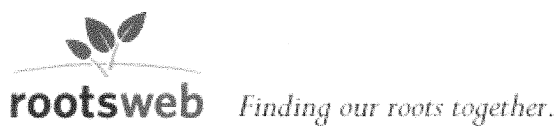

Elias Sill Hawley of Buffalo, New York, compiled a comprehensive HAWLEY genealogy over 40 years of research on descendants of Joseph Hawley of Stratford, Connecticut, and published THE HAWLEY RECORD in 1890. The Massachusetts line of Thomas Hawley, possibly a brother of Joseph of Stratford, also appears. In addition, Elias Hawley listed many unconnected HAWLEY families. Although Elias Hawley endeavored to include all known lines of the HAWLEY surname, several HAWLEY families were unintentionally omitted.
