Wesley Sutter Eichenlaub, 78, Tampa, Fla., a former state representative from Lee county and a long-time local businessman, died at 12:45 p.m. Saturday in St. Elizabeth hospital, Tampa.

He had been in failing health several months.

Mr. Eichenlaub moved to Tampa from Fort Madison about two years ago.

Mr. Eichenlaub served in the Iowa House of Representatives in 1959-60 and 1961-62.

He also was a past member of the Fort Madison school board, serving for nine years, two years as its president.

For 33 years, he owned and operated the former Eichenlaub Jewelry Store here, retiring in 1955. He was a past member of the board of directors of the Chamber of Commerce.

Mr. Eichenlaub was born Sept. 19, 1895, at Kansas City, Mo.

On July 28, 1919, he married Don't Williams, who died in January 1964.

Mr. Eichenlaub was a member of the First Christian church here, the Fort Madison Elks lodge and the Fort Madison Country club. He was a past president of the Fort Madison Lions club.

A veteran of World War I, he was also a member of the American Legion, the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Disabled American Veterans.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. James (Collette) Elledge, Tampa; a sister, Mrs. Marvin S. Hensley, Mission, Kan.; and five grandchildren.

His parents were George and Minnie Sutter Eichenlaub.

The body is being brought to Barr Memorial Chapel where final rites will be at 1 p.m. Wednesday. The Rev. Paul Williamson will officiate. Burial will be in Hill Crest Memorial Park.

The family will meet friends at the Barr Chapel from 7 to 8:30 Tuesday evening.

Mrs. Alida S. Huffman, 63, 1833 Avenue F, died at 6:50 p.m. Sunday in Sacred Heart hospital. She had been in failing health for two years, seriously ill the past two weeks.
