This year, the winter windfall for public servants in the central government came to an average of \$2,400, with the "bonus" paid to Prime Minister Zenko Suzuki and the chief justice of the supreme court topping the list at \$18,186.

WHILE GOVERNMENT bonuses are set according to a fixed scale,

The stakes are high, as a recent bank survey showed 54% of the bonus pay packet would go to savings, such as education funds for the growing children or house-buying schemes.

Hoschek succumbs to illness

Carl Hoschek, an Austrian immigrant who rose to serve his adopted nation from the Iowa Senate and later became mayor of Burlington, is dead at 89.

Mr. Hoschek, of 2928 Cliff Road, died at 10 p.m. Saturday, Dec. 12, in Elm View Care Center after a year's illness.

His career as brickmason and contractor spanned a half century. He was elected state representative from Des Moines County in 1949, was a state senator from 1956-60 and later served one term as mayor of Burlington.

He was born Aug. 16, 1892, in Moravia, Austria, to Adolph and Philomena Hoschek. He married Agnes C. Walsh June 16, 1919, in West Burlington; she died Nov. 10, 1979.

A U.S. Army veteran of World War I, Mr. Hoschek was a life member of the VFW, former commander of World War I Veterans, a member of the Eagles, Brick Masons Union Local 10, St. Mary Catholic Church, West Burlington, and Burlington Natural Foods Association.

Surviving: one daughter, Katherine M. Jay, and two sons, Paul H. and Stephen M., all of Burlington; 19 grandchildren; 20 great-grandchildren.

Funeral: 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, Prugh's Chapel, the Rev. Louis Mulligan; Aspen Grove Cemetery with military rites. Rosary: 7:30 tonight, Prugh's Chapel. A memorial has been established at St. Mary Church.
