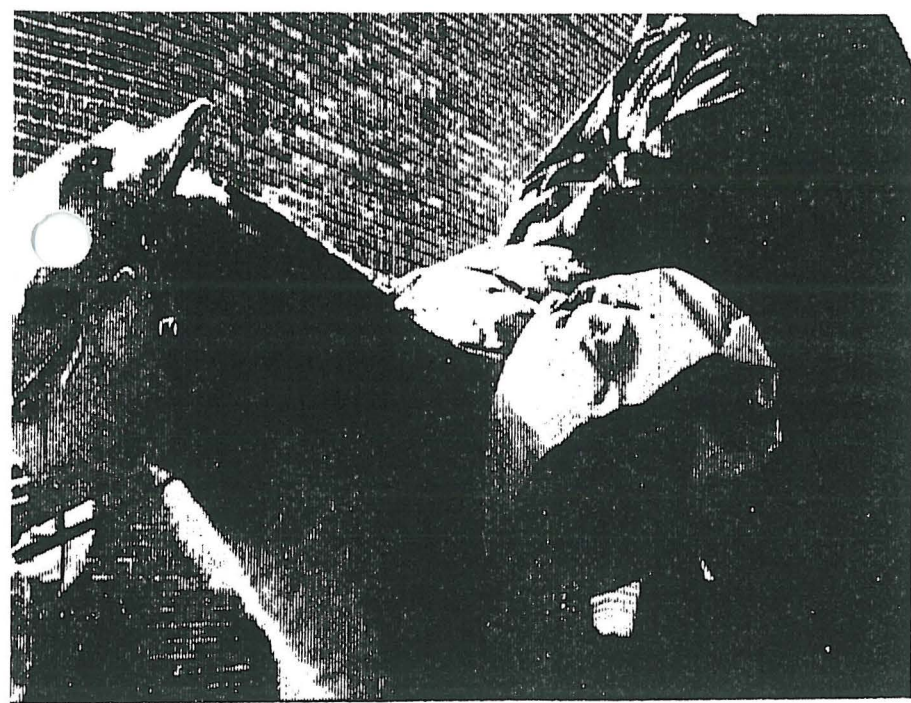

Homer E. Millen, 78, died Monday at 6 a.m. in a hotel at Whitehall, Mont., where he had been on business.

He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. C C. Millen, born Jan. 12 1889, at Indianola. He married Pearl Wright on Jan. 9, 1913, at Indianola. She survives. He moved here 34 years ago after living at Hampton and Douds.

He formerly operated a rock quarry but was retired at the time of his death. He was a member of the Methodist Church and all Masonic bodies.

Surviving are one son, Floyd, state representative, of Farmington; three grandsons; and one-half sister, Helene Mitchell of Wilmington, Calif.

Services will be held Thursday at 2 p.m. at the Methodist Church with burial in Greenglade Cemetery. Millers Home For Funerals is in charge of arrangements.

Harmony School To Open

Schools in the Harmony Community School District will open Monday, August 28th. School will be held all day on the first day and lunch will be served in the various buildings.

The high school will be housed in the centrally located building. Bonaparte and Hillsboro centers will house grades Kindergarten through six. In addition, four special education classes and one "Head Start" class will be housed at Bonaparte. The special education classes are administered by the county board of education and the Head Start by the Office of Economic Opportunity. The Farmington Center will house grades Kindergarten through six plus the junior high school for the entire Harmony District.

Again this year, Kindergarten will be held in the morning at Bonaparte and Hillsboro, and in the afternoon at Farmington. Any new Kindergarten students in the district who have not registered should do so and obtain physical examination forms as soon as possible. The minimum age for Kindergarten corresponds with the state requirements. This means a child must be five by September 15, if he is to start to Kindergarten this year.

Teachers Workshop for all teachers in the system will be held in the high school cafeteria beginning at 9:00 A. M. on Thursday, August 24.

Guidance Counselor, David Alderton, and Principal, H. T. Jobe, will be in their offices at the high school on Tuesday, August 22 from 9:00 A. M. to 12:00 noon and from 1:00 to 4:00 P. M. for registration of high school students who did not register last spring. Any new students or any students who wish to change their registration should come at this time, if possible.
