Marion A. Cagley, age 96, Ionia, died Monday afternoon, March 9 at Health Care Manor, New Hampton.

Funeral services will be Friday, March 13 at 10:00 a.m. at the United Church of Christ, Ionia with burial at Greenwood Cemetery, Nashua. The Rev. Robert Duckett will officiate and music will be furnished by grandson, Rex Markle, and organist, Sherri Wait.

Casket bearers will be grandsons, Wayne Van Andel, Leslie J. Schroeder, Mark Meyers, Gary Meyers, Craig Meyers, and Mike Cagley.

Marion was born May 4, 1895 at Ionia, the son of Michael and Anna (Miller) Cagley. He was united in marriage to Bernice Cushing at Sioux City in 1923. A life long rural Ionia farmer, Marion was also active in Farm Bureau, serving this organization as both County president and voting delegate.

He was Chickasaw Township school secretary for many years, a Representative in the Iowa Legislature, a member of the Nashua School Board, Chickasaw Township assessor. He also served on the election board for many years and was a member of the Congregational United Church of Christ in Ionia for 82 years.
